A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LIBRARIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 312, Hawaii Revised Statutes, sets
2	forth the duties and responsibilities of the state board of
3	education. This Act makes housekeeping changes that will more
4	accurately reflect long-standing board of education and Hawaii
5	state public library system practice. These duties and
6	responsibilities, which were initially assigned to the board of
7	education, have been delegated to the state librarian and the
8	Hawaii state public library system for many decades.
9	SECTION 2. Chapter 312, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
11	and to read as follows:
12	"§312- State librarian; appointment; duties. The state
13	librarian shall collect, purchase, receive gifts of, and
14	otherwise acquire all books and other publications proper for
15	libraries, and arrange, classify, and catalog the same; provide
16	for their safekeeping; expend moneys appropriated by the
17	legislature and otherwise acquired for the development, use,
18	support, and maintenance of libraries; provide ways and means

- 1 for placing libraries within reach of all residents throughout
- 2 the State and particularly of all public and private school
- 3 children; provide and maintain branch libraries, offices, or
- 4 places for the distribution of books and periodicals throughout
- 5 the State; enter into contracts as may be necessary to carry
- 6 into effect the general duties herein imposed; appoint such
- 7 officers and employees as deemed necessary, all of whom shall be
- 8 under the authority of the governor for purposes of chapters 76,
- 9 78, 89, and 89C; and adopt rules for the management and use of
- 10 libraries, and for the control of the property under its
- 11 management."
- SECTION 3. Section 312-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 "§312-1 Duties of the board of education. The board of
- 15 education shall care for, manage, and control all property set
- 16 apart, donated, loaned to, or in any manner acquired for the use
- 17 of libraries; receive, care for, expend, and account for any
- 18 money which may be received for the purpose of erecting
- 19 buildings for libraries or for any other purposes of the
- 20 libraries[; collect, purchase, receive gifts-of, and otherwise
- 21 acquire all books and other publications proper for libraries,
- 22 and arrange, classify, and catalogue the same; provide for their

safekeeping; expend moneys appropriated by the legislature and 2 otherwise acquired for the development, use, support, and 3 maintenance of libraries; provide ways and means for placing libraries within reach of all residents throughout the State and 4 particularly of all public and private school children; provide 5 6 and maintain-branch libraries, offices, or places for the 7 distribution of books and periodicals throughout the State; make 8 such contracts as may be necessary to carry into effect the 9 general duties herein imposed; appoint such officers and employees—as it deems necessary; and make rules for the 10 management and use of libraries, and for the control of the 11 property under its management]." 12 SECTION 4. Section 312-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 14 amended to read as follows: "§312-2 Powers of board; special fund. The board of 15 education may: 16 17 (1)Except as provided in section 312-3.9, make arrangements or contracts as are approved by the 18 19 governor, with any county, city, association, society, person, or persons, for the purpose of benefiting the 20 21 libraries and increasing their facilities and use;

1	(2)	Subject to section 26-12, enter into such arrangement
2		or contract as is approved by the governor, with the
3		Friends of the Library of Hawaii, affiliates of the
4	V.	Friends of the Library of Hawaii, and any tax-exempt
5		organization recognized under Section 501(c)(3) of
6		the Internal Revenue Code whose primary purpose is to
7		support a state library branch for the purpose of
8		obtaining the use of the books and property and income
9		of the Friends of the Library of Hawaii, its
10	÷	affiliates, and such tax-exempt non-profit
11		organizations;
12	(3)	Cooperate by exchange and otherwise with libraries now
13		existing or hereafter to be formed;
14	(4)	Receive, use, manage, or invest moneys or other
15		property, real, personal, or mixed which may be given,
16		bequeathed, devised, or in any manner received from
17		sources other than the legislature or any federal
18		appropriation for any or all purposes of the
19		libraries;
20	(5)	Deposit with the director of finance in a special fund
21		all moneys donated to the board for library services;

Unless otherwise provided for by the terms and 1 (6) conditions of the donation, convert, at such time as 2 3 the board may at its sole discretion determine, any or all donations of property, real, personal, or mixed, 4 into money to be deposited into the special fund; and 5 Expend the moneys in the special fund in accordance (7) 6 with the terms and conditions of each donation for the 7 8 purposes of the libraries. 9 The board shall be the trustee of the special fund and all 10 moneys therein shall be deemed to have been appropriated to the 11 use and for the purposes of the [board] Hawaii state public 12 library system in providing library services. Nothing in this 13 section shall be construed to limit the powers and duties of the board hereinbefore expressed, or to empower the board to 14 obligate the State financially in any sum which shall not have 15 been appropriated by the legislature for the use of the board." 16 SECTION 5. Section 312-4.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 18 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 19 The [board of education] state librarian may charge and add a fee to any amount due in accordance with [its] the 20 state librarian's duties and powers under section [312-1] 21 312- for: 22

1	(1)	Any cost or expense incurred by the Hawaii state
2		public library system as a result of any action taken
3		to enforce the collection of costs of lost books and
4		any overdue fines and fees charged to that patron
5		after the public library system has mailed written
6		notice demanding payment and advising that continued
7		failure to pay the amount due may result in collection
8		action being taken, including the imposition of cost-
9		recovery fees, not to exceed \$10, pursuant to this
10		section. Any cost-recovery fee charged against the
11		patron for costs, fees, and other charges may include
12		collection agency fees, attorneys' fees, court filing
13		fees, and similar fees incurred by the Hawaii state
14		public library system in connection with the
15		collection action;
16	(2)	Hawaii public library system sponsored seminars or
17		workshops, including educational materials in various
18		media format; and
19	(3)	Research and reference materials published on magnetic
20		media, CD-ROM, or other [machine-readable] digital or
21		electronic form."

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SECTION 6. Section 312-4.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:

PURPOSE:

To update chapter 312, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to accurately reflect longstanding State Board of Education and Hawaii

State Public Library System Practice.

MEANS:

Add a new section to chapter 312 and amend sections 312-1, 312-2, 312-4.6(a) and (d),

312-5, and 312-21(a), HRS.

JUSTIFICATION:

Chapter 312, HRS, assigns various duties and responsibilities to the State Board of Education. In practice, the board does not, and has not, performed these duties and responsibilities; they have been delegated to the State Librarian and the Hawaii State Public Library System. This bill will amend chapter 312, HRS, so that it more accurately reflects the duties and responsibilities of the Board of Education, Hawaii State Public Library System, and the State Librarian.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Duties and responsibilities currently assigned to the State Board of Education will be assigned to the State Librarian and the Hawaii State Public Library System.
