A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE INSPECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to provide the 2 director of transportation greater authority over the motor 3 vehicle inspection program so that the cost to a vehicle owner 4 for an inspection, the fees collected from inspection stations, 5 and the administration of the program can be changed by amending administrative rules pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised 6 7 Statutes. There is a need to upgrade the methods and procedures 8 of state motor vehicle inspections because the current system is 9 inefficient in that legislation needs to be passed every time an inspection fee is amended. 10

11 This Act also reduces the amount of insurance information 12 required on an inspection certificate. This will reduce data 13 entry requirements for inspectors without degrading the function 14 of checking insurance cards. Digital images of the insurance 15 cards will be stored for easy retrieval should a need for 16 additional information arise.

17 SECTION 2. Section 286-26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows: 2016-1826 HB970 SD1 SMA.doc

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1	"(e) Upon application for a certificate of inspection to
2	be issued for a vehicle, an inspection as prescribed by the
3	director under subsection (g) shall be conducted on the vehicle,
4	and if the vehicle is found to be in [a safe operating
5	condition,] compliance with the inspection requirements, a
6	certificate of inspection shall be issued upon payment of a fee
7	to be determined by the director. The certificate shall state
8	[the effective date, the termination date, the name of the
9	issuing-insurance carrier, and the policy number of]:
10	(1) The insurance expiration date shown on the motor
11	vehicle insurance identification card for the
12	inspected motor vehicle as specified by section
13	431:10C-107 or as determined from a certificate of
14	self-insurance issued by the state insurance
15	commissioner as specified by section 431:10C-606; or
16	[state_the]
17	(2) The information contained in the proof of insurance
18	card as specified by section 431:10G-106.
19	[A] <u>An inspection</u> sticker, authorized by the director, shall be
20	affixed to the vehicle at the time a certificate of inspection
21	is issued. An inspection sticker which has been lost, stolen,

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1 or destroyed shall be replaced without reinspection by the 2 inspection station that issued the original inspection sticker upon presentation of the vehicle's current certificate of 3 4 inspection; provided that the current certificate of inspection and inspection sticker shall not have expired at the time the 5 6 replacement is requested. The director shall adopt rules to 7 determine the fee for replacement of lost, stolen, or destroyed 8 inspection stickers." 9 SECTION 3. Section 286-209, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended by amending subsections (b), (c), and (d) to read as 11 follows: 12 The director shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 "(b) for the administration and enforcement of motor carrier vehicle 13 14 safety inspections, including the maximum inspection fee to vehicle owners, fees collected from the stations, the issuance 15 of certificates of safety inspection, the affixing of motor 16 17 carrier vehicle safety inspection [decals,] stickers, and the 18 acceptance of certificates of safety inspection issued in other 19 jurisdictions.

20 (c) The director shall <u>initially</u> collect a fee of \$1.50
21 for each motor carrier vehicle safety inspection [decal] <u>sticker</u>

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1	issued by motor carrier vehicle inspection stations[$.$], then
2	collect the maximum inspection fee when the fee is established
3	by administrative rules pursuant to subsection (b). All moneys
4	[collected] received by the department of transportation
5	pursuant to this section shall be [paid] deposited into the
6	state highway fund.
7	(d) A fee of no more than \$12 shall <u>initially</u> be charged
8	by a motor carrier inspection station for each safety inspection
9	performed [\div], then no more than the maximum inspection fee shall
10	be charged when the fee is established by administrative rules
11	pursuant to subsection (b)."
12	SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
13	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
14	begun, before its effective date.
15	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
