A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTERDEPARTMENTAL REPORTING ON DIABETES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
- 3 designated and to read as follows:
- 4 "§321- Diabetes reporting. (a) The department of
- 5 health, in collaboration with the department of human services
- 6 and department of human resources development, shall identify
- 7 goals and benchmarks and develop departmental plans to reduce
- 8 the incidence of diabetes in the State, improve diabetes care,
- 9 and reduce complications associated with diabetes.
- 10 (b) The department of health, in collaboration with the
- 11 department of human services and department of human resources
- 12 development, shall submit a biennial report to the legislature
- 13 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular
- 14 session in odd numbered years on the following:
- 15 (1) The health, societal, and financial impacts that
- diabetes of all types has on the State, counties, and

12		appropriations; provided that the report shall
13		identify expected outcomes of the proposed
14		legislation."
15	SECT	ION 2. The requirements of section 1 of this Act shall
16	be limited	d to the diabetes information, data, initiatives, and
17	programs v	within each department prior to the effective date of
18	this Act,	unless there is unencumbered funding for diabetes
19	prevention	n in each agency that may be used for new research,
20	data colle	ection, reporting, or other requirements of section 1
21	of this Ad	et.
