A BILL FOR AN ACT

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The university may establish 2 accounts-under-the community services special fund to facilitate 3 the administration of this fund among the various campuses and 4 operating-units-of the University-of Hawaii system. All 5 expenditures from this fund shall be subject to legislative 6 appropriation. (b) As used in this-section, "public service programs" 7 8 means: 9 Noncredit educational programs in-professional $\frac{(1)}{(1)}$ 10 development and training, personal growth, and 11 cultural enrichment; and 12 (2) Cooperative extension and consultative services." 13 PART II 14 SECTION 3. The purpose of this part is to reclassify the Hawaii educator loan program special fund as a revolving fund. 15 16 The legislature finds that the fund functions as, and meets **17** the criteria for, a revolving fund and should be reclassified as 18 a revolving fund. 19 SECTION 4.
