

## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTING AND GENERAL SERVICES, AND UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TO CREATE A TRAFFIC MITIGATION PLAN FOR THE LEEWARD AND CENTRAL AREA OF OAHU.

1 WHEREAS, traffic congestion is a serious problem faced by cities around the country and throughout the world; and 2 3 WHEREAS, traffic congestion negatively impacts the quality 4 of life for many residents of Oahu, especially for working 5 professionals and students commuting from outside the 6 metropolitan Honolulu area; and 7 8 WHEREAS, traffic congestion in Honolulu is consistently 9 ranked as one of the worst in the nation, ranking second in a 10 report by INRIX, a traffic information and driver services 11 12 company; and 13 WHEREAS, according to TomTom's traffic index, the average 14 commute time in Honolulu is approximately thirty minutes, and a 15 16 commuter will experience around seventy-six hours of delays per year; and 17 18 WHEREAS, increased traffic in Hawaii contributes to a 19 surprising rate of around 10,000 serious traffic accidents a 20 year, resulting in between one hundred-twenty and one hundred-21 fifty fatalities and 8,000 to 12,000 individuals being seriously 22 injured; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, the problems with traffic in Honolulu are particularly pronounced in weekday commutes between metropolitan 26 Honolulu and the Leeward and Central area of Oahu; and 27



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WHEREAS, this problem may worsen with the growth of Kapolei 1 and the Ewa region, particularly with recent economic forecasts 2 predicting job growth in the Ewa market of more than 67,000 new 3 jobs over the next decade and a half; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, although residential development and job-growth 7 occur at a rapid pace, decreasing the need for some residents to commute to downtown Honolulu, the Ewa Development Plan of 2011 8 9 acknowledges that commuting to downtown Honolulu from the Ewa region remains a problem. The average commute time is at least 10 seventy-five-minutes, with-twenty per-cent of commuters spending 11 almost ninety minutes commuting to downtown Honolulu on a 12 13 regular basis, and commuters have stated that it takes an average of twenty to twenty-five minutes just to get out of Ewa 14 15 Beach; and 16 17 WHEREAS, common experience for both working professionals and students commuting from the Leeward region demonstrates that 18 congested conditions exist due to traffic funneling onto major 19 arterials with insufficient capacity stemming from Makakilo 20 Drive to downtown Honolulu; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the poor commuting experience from the Leeward 23 region is exacerbated by increased traffic congestion resulting 24 from roadway closures and groundwork during the construction of 25 26 the high-capacity rapid transit system; now, therefore, 27 28 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 29 30 Session of 2016, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Transportation, in partnership with the Department of Accounting 31 and General Services and the Department of Urban and Regional 32 Planning at the University of Hawai'i, the Honolulu Authority for 33 Rapid Transportation, Department of Transportation Services, 34 Hawaii Community Development Authority, and the Office of 35 Planning is requested to establish a traffic mitigation plan for 36

37 the Leeward and Central region of Oahu; and





BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Transportation, the State Comptroller, and the President of the University of Hawai'i.

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
