HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING GAME MAMMAL, GAME BIRD, AND FISHING RESOURCES IN ORDER TO PROMOTE SUSTAINABILITY AND FOOD SECURITY AND TO PRESERVE LONG STANDING LOCAL AND CULTURAL PRACTICES.

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, Hawaii imports between eighty-five and ninety percent of its food, and in the event of a natural disaster or global event that prevents food shipment, Hawaii could face a devastating food shortage; and

6	WHEREAS, the practices of fishing and hunting have a long
7	history in the culture of Hawaii; and

9 10	WHEREAS, today, the availability of fresh, locally-caught fish is a basic expectation in our communities; and

12	WHEREAS, residents on the island of Molokai receive
13	approximately forty percent of their daily sustenance from
14	subsistence sources such as fishing, hunting, and backyard
15	farming; and

17	WHEREAS, the residents of the island of Hawaii harvest up
18	to 1,000,000 pounds of game each year; and
19 20	WHEREAS, in 1978, the State of Hawaii held a Constitutional
20 21	Convention; and

23	WHEREAS, a proposal of the 1978 Constitutional Convention
24	removed the former section 1 of the former Article X, which
25	read: "Section 1. The legislature shall promote the
26	conservation, development and utilization of agricultural
27	resources, and fish, mineral, forest, water, land, game and
28 20	other natural resources."; and
29 30	WHEREAS, if the amendment is purely stylistic and technical
30 31	in nature, and does not alter the sense, meaning, or effect of
32	any provision of the Constitution, it was approved by the

1 electorate and has become a part of the revised Constitution; and 2 3 WHEREAS, on the other hand, if the amendment alters the 4 5 sense, meaning, or effect of any provision of the Constitution, it was not ratified and is not effective to change the language 6 7 of the Constitution; and 8 WHEREAS, this alteration of the Constitution drastically 9 changes the sense and meaning of the Constitution, the 10 11 sustainability of resources, and the effect on the culture and practices of the people of Hawaii; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, game mammals and game birds are a sustainable food source, and our State's unique relationship with the ocean 15 allows us the opportunity to integrate the local fish and game 16 17 industry into our food security profile; and 18 WHEREAS, policies on conservation and protection of 19 terrestrial and marine resources should promote the concept that 20 game mammals, game birds, and marine resources are an integral 21 22 part of our island culture; now, therefore, 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 24 Twenty-eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 25 Session of 2016, the Senate concurring, that this body 26 recognizes that pioneered introductions, such as the pig, and 27 later sustainability introductions, such as goats, sheep, deer, 28 which are now recognized as game mammal and game bird resources, 29 30 should be included among the natural resources recognized by the Hawaii Constitution; and 31 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body urges the conservation, development and utilization of agricultural 34 35 resources, fish, minerals, forests, water, land, game mammals, game birds, and other natural resources; and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body urges state 38 39 departments to develop and update their rules and policies to 40 integrate the local hunting and fishing industries into any food 41 security or sustainability strategies they employ and to preserve, protect, and promote these industries to nurture them 42
