## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO VIGOROUSLY ENFORCE LAWS REGARDING THE LABELING OF PREVIOUSLY FROZEN FISH.

1	WHEREAS, catching, selling, and consuming fresh fish are
2	important to the culture, economy, and diet of the State; and
3	WURDER Greek fish is united by work concurrence is a
4	WHEREAS, fresh fish is prized by many consumers, is a necessary ingredient for many traditional dishes, and can
5 6	command higher prices than frozen fish; and
7	command higher prices chan riozen rish, and
8	WHEREAS, some retailers of frozen fish have mislabeled
9	their previously frozen fish as fresh fish after treating the
10	fish with carbon monoxide to preserve the color, but not the
11	quality, of the fish; and

13	WHEREAS, part III of chapter 328, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
14	requires that previously frozen food products be clearly labeled
15	with the words "previously frozen"; and

17	WHEREAS, treating fish with carbon monoxide as a color stabilizer is permissible in the United States but has been
18 19	banned in other places, including the European Union; and
19 20	baimed in other places, including the European onion, and
20	WHEREAS, carbon monoxide may mask visual evidence of fish
22	spoilage and mislead consumers into purchasing fish they would
23	not otherwise purchase; and

25	WHEREAS, some consumers do not want to eat previously
26	frozen fish, or any fish that has been treated with carbon
27	monoxide, because they do not enjoy the taste or have concerns
28	about possible negative health effects; and

WHEREAS, mislabeling previously frozen fish as fresh fish 1 misleads consumers and allows vendors of previously frozen fish 2 to unfairly compete with vendors of genuine fresh fish; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Department of Health is authorized to seek an 5 injunction and assess a fine of up to \$500 for each violation of 6 the requirement that previously frozen fish be labeled as such, 7 8 pursuant to sections 328-63 and 328-64, Hawaii Revised Statutes; 9 and 10 WHEREAS, the authority of the Department of Health to 11 enforce labeling requirements of part III of chapter 328, Hawaii 12 Revised Statutes, is subject to the department's discretion; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the Department of Health may determine that, in 15 some cases, issuing a warning, rather than seeking an injunction 16 or assessing a fine, is a better way to enforce the labeling 17 requirements pertaining to frozen fish; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the ultimate responsibility of the Department of 20 Health is to enforce laws to protect the public health 21 generally; and 22 23 WHEREAS, some vendors of mislabeled frozen fish may seek to 24 exploit the Department of Health's discretion regarding 25 enforcement, and may repeatedly mislabel carbon monoxide-treated 26 previously frozen fish as fresh fish because they believe they 27 will face no serious consequences if they are caught so doing; 28 29 now, therefore, 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 31 Twenty-eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 32 Session of 2016, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 33 Health is urged to vigorously enforce part III of chapter 328, 34 Hawaii Revised Statutes, by pursuing injunctions and fines 35 against persons who mislabel previously frozen fish as fresh 36 fish, especially in cases where the same violation has occurred 37 multiple times and the Department has previously warned the 38 violator of the laws pertaining to labeling previously frozen 39 foods; and 40 41
