A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the population of
- 2 the area of Kakaako in the city and county of Honolulu has
- 3 recently undergone a dramatic increase in population. There has
- 4 been the development of numerous residential condominiums and an
- 5 increase in businesses serving the residents. Correspondingly,
- 6 there has been a steady and marked increase of calls for
- 7 emergency medical services in the Kakaako area.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
- 9 department of health for the purchase of an ambulance vehicle
- 10 and the operational costs for one ambulance unit, including
- 11 equipment, supplies, and personnel costs for state-certified
- 12 emergency medical service personnel, to serve the area of
- 13 Kakaako in the city and county of Honolulu.
- 14 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 16 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and
- 17 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal

- 6 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
