A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HOUSELESS BILL OF RIGHTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

I	SECTION 1.	The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new cha	apter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:

5		HOUSELESS BILL OF RIGHTS
6	§ -1 De:	finitions. As used in this chapter, unless the
7	context otherwis	se requires:
8	"Houseless" means:	
9	(1) An ind	dividual or family who lacks a fixed, regular,
10	and ac	dequate night-time residence; or
11	(2) An ind	dividual or family who has a primary night-time
12	reside	ence that is:
13	(A) A	A supervised publicly or privately operated
14	8	shelter designed to provide temporary living
15	ā	accommodations;
16	(B) A	An institution that provides temporary residence
17	i	for individuals intended to be institutionalized;
18		or

1	(C) A public or private place not designed for or	
2	ordinarily used as sleeping accommodations for	
3	human beings.	
4	This term does not include any individual imprisoned or	
5	otherwise detained under an act of Congress or a state law.	
6	"Life-sustaining activities" includes but is not limited to	
7	eating, sleeping, standing, sitting, and using and moving freely	
8	in a public space.	
9	§ -2 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to	
10	ameliorate adverse effects visited upon individuals when those	
11	individuals lack a home.	
12	§ -3 Houseless bill of rights; findings. The	
13	legislature finds that no person's rights, privileges, or access	
14	to public services may be denied solely because a person is	
15	houseless, and a houseless individual shall be granted the same	
16	rights as any other person.	
17	§ -4 Bill of rights. (a) The houseless bill of rights	
18	includes the following guarantees to houseless individuals:	
19	(1) The right to engage in life-sustaining activities,	
20	including the right to use and move freely in public	

spaces, including but not limited to public sidewalks,

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1		public parks, public transportation, and public
2		buildings, in the same manner as any other person
3		without discrimination on the basis of housing status;
4	(2)	The right to equal treatment by all state and county
5		agencies without discrimination on the basis of
6		housing status;
7.	(3)	The right to access fair housing and equal employment
8		opportunity without discrimination due to the lack of
9		a permanent mailing address or the fact that the
10		individual's mailing address is the mailing address of
11		a shelter or social service provider;
12	(4)	The right to emergency medical care free from
13		discrimination on the basis of housing status;
14	(5)	The right to vote, register to vote, and receive
15		documentation necessary to prove identity for voting
16		without discrimination on the basis of housing status;
17	(6)	The right to protection from disclosure of records and
18		information, without proper legal authority, and the
19		right to confidentiality of records and information in
20		accordance with the Federal Homeless Management
21		Information System, the Patient Protection and

1		Allordable care Act, and the rederal violence Against
2		Women Act;
3	(7)	The right to a reasonable expectation of privacy in
4		personal property, including but not limited to
5		identification, food, water, medication, and all
6		objects necessary for life-sustaining activities, such
7		as clothing, blankets, pillows, and backpacks, to the
8		same extent as personal property in a permanent
9		residence;
10	(8)	The right to access temporary and permanent shelters
11		without discrimination on the basis of any protected
12		class;
13 ⁻	(9)	The right to sleep in a legally parked automobile;
14		provided that the automobile is properly registered,
15		licensed, safety inspected, and insured;
16	(10)	The equal opportunity to have twenty-four-hour access
17		to public hygiene facilities and live in decent, safe,
18		sanitary, and healthful accommodations anywhere within
19		the State, regardless of housing status, but not
20		including access to environmentally sensitive areas;
21		and

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1	(11)	Action by the State, a county, or private organization
2		shall not impede an individual's ability to maintain
3		access to services essential to survival, including
4		but not limited to medical services, shelter, food,
5		and water.
6	(b)	The rights afforded to houseless persons to ensure
7	that their	person, privacy, and property are safeguarded and
8	protected as set forth in this chapter are available only	
9	insofar as they are implemented in accordance with other state	
10	or county	laws, state rules and regulations, federal law, and
11	the consti	tutions of the State and the United States."
12	SECTI	ON 2. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059.
