A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HEALTH IMPACTS OF PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
3	to read a	s follows:
4	11	PART . MANDATORY DISCLOSURE OF PESTICIDE USE
5	§321	- Definitions. As used in this part, unless the
6	context c	learly requires otherwise:
7	"Act	ive ingredient" means:
8	(1)	In the case of a pesticide other than a plant
9		regulator, defoliant, or desiccant, an ingredient that
10		will prevent, destroy, repel, or mitigate any pest;
11	(2)	In the case of a plant regulator, an ingredient that,
12		through physiological action, will accelerate or
13		retard the rate of growth or maturation or otherwise
14		alter the behavior of ornamental or crop plants or the
15		produce thereof;

- 1 (3) In the case of a defoliant, an ingredient that will cause the leaves or foliage to drop from the plant;
 3 and
- 4 (4) In the case of a desiccant, an ingredient that will artificially accelerate the drying of plant tissues.
- "Crops" means commodities produced from the earth that are planted, raised, and gathered within the course of a single season.
- 9 "Department" means the department of health.
- "Defoliant" means any substance or mixture of substances
 intended for causing the leaves or foliage to drop from the
 plant, with or without causing abscission.
- "Desiccant" means any substance or mixture of substances
 intended for artificially accelerating the drying of plant
 tissue.
- "Inert ingredient" means an ingredient that is not an
 active ingredient.
- "Pest" means any insect, rodent, nematode, fungus, weed, or any other form of terrestrial or aquatic plant or animal life or virus, bacterium, or any other microorganism, except viruses,
- 21 bacterium, or any other microorganisms on or in living humans or

I	other livi	ng animals, that the Administrator of the United
2	States Env	rironmental Protection Agency determines to be a pest.
3	"Pest	icide" means any substance or mixture of substances
4	intended f	or preventing, destroying, repelling, or mitigating
5	any pest,	and any substance or mixture of substances intended
6	for use as	an attractant, plant regulator, defoliant, or
7	desiccant.	A product shall be deemed to be a pesticide
8	regardless	of whether it is intended for use as packaged, or as
9	a dilution	or mixture with substances such as carriers or baits
10	Products n	ot considered pesticides include:
11	(1)	Deodorants, bleaching agents, and cleaning agents for
12		which no pesticidal claims are made or implied;
13	(2)	Embalming fluids;
14	(3)	Building materials that have been treated to protect
15		the material itself against any pest and bear no
16		claims for protection of other surfaces or objects;
17	(4)	Fabrics that have been treated to protect the fabric
18		itself from insects, fungi, or any other pests;

(5) Fertilizer and other plant nutrients; and

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1	(6) Products intended only for use after further
2	processing or manufacturing, such as grinding to dust
3	or other operations.
4	§321- Establishment; program. The department shall
5	establish and administer a program relating to disclosure of
6	pesticide use by any person or entity. The department shall
7	develop a standardized reporting form.
8	§321- Mandatory disclosure requirements. (a) Beginning
9	July 1, 2016, all persons or entities that cultivate crops on
10	two hundred or more acres within a single county in any calendar
11	year shall disclose the use of all pesticides in accordance with
12	this section.
13	(b) For each month of the reporting year, the person or
14	entity shall report to the department the use of all pesticides
15	used in the preceding month. For each use, the report shall
16	include:
17	(1) The pesticide's trade name, federal and state
18	registration or permit number, commercial product
19	name, active and inert ingredients, and gallons or
20	pounds used;

1	(2)	The method, date, and total quantity of each	
2		application;	
3	(3)	The geographic location of each application, by	
4		address and tax map key number, and, where	
5		appropriate, field number; and	
6	(4)	The total acreage and the area size where the	
7		pesticide was used.	
8	§321	- Public disclosure requirements. Beginning	
9	October 1	, 2016, the department shall post online on the	
10	departmen	t's website a summary of each monthly report received	
11	under this	s part and, for each month, the failure of any person	
12	or entity	to comply with this part."	
13	SECT	ION 2. If any provision of this Act, or the	
14	application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held		
15	invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or		
16	application	ons of the Act that can be given effect without the	
17	invalid provision or application, and to this end the provision		
18	of this A	ct are severable.

Description:

Requires the department of health to establish a mandatory disclosure program for pesticide use by all persons or entities under certain circumstances.

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
