A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HEALTH IMPACTS OF PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
3	to read a	s follows:

5	§321	- Definitions. As used in this part, unless the
6	context c	learly requires otherwise:
7	"Act	ive ingredient" means:
8	(1)	In the case of a pesticide other than a plant
9		regulator, defoliant, or desiccant, an ingredient that
10		will prevent, destroy, repel, or mitigate any pest;
11	(2)	In the case of a plant regulator, an ingredient that,
12		through physiological action, will accelerate or
13		retard the rate of growth or maturation or otherwise
14		alter the behavior of ornamental or crop plants or the
15		produce thereof;
16	(3)	In the case of a defoliant, an ingredient that will
17		cause the leaves or foliage to drop from the plant;
18		and

- 1 (4) In the case of a desiccant, an ingredient that will
- 2 artificially accelerate the drying of plant tissues.
- 3 "Crops" means commodities produced from the earth that are
- 4 planted, raised, and gathered within the course of a single
- 5 season.
- 6 "Defoliant" means any substance or mixture of substances
- 7 intended for causing the leaves or foliage to drop from the
- 8 plant, with or without causing abscission.
- 9 "Department" means the department of health.
- 10 "Desiccant" means any substance or mixture of substances
- 11 intended for artificially accelerating the drying of plant
- 12 tissue.
- "Inert ingredient" means an ingredient that is not an
- 14 active ingredient.
- 15 "Pest" means any insect, rodent, nematode, fungus, weed, or
- 16 any other form of terrestrial or aquatic plant or animal life or
- 17 virus, bacterium, or any other microorganism, except viruses,
- 18 bacterium, or any other microorganisms on or in living humans or
- 19 other living animals, that the Administrator of the United
- 20 States Environmental Protection Agency determines to be a pest.

1	"Pes	ticide" means any substance or mixture of substances
2	intended	for preventing, destroying, repelling, or mitigating
3	any pest,	and any substance or mixture of substances intended
4	for use a	s an attractant, plant regulator, defoliant, or
5	desiccant	. A product shall be deemed to be a pesticide
6	regardles	s of whether it is intended for use as packaged, or as
7	a dilutio	n or mixture with substances such as carriers or baits
8	Products	not considered pesticides include:
9	(1)	Deodorants, bleaching agents, and cleaning agents for
10		which no pesticidal claims are made or implied;
11	(2)	Embalming fluids;
12	(3)	Building materials that have been treated to protect
13		the material itself against any pest and bear no
14		claims for protection of other surfaces or objects;
15	(4)	Fabrics that have been treated to protect the fabric
16		itself from insects, fungi, or any other pests;
17	(5)	Fertilizer and other plant nutrients; and
18	(6)	Products intended only for use after further
19		processing or manufacturing, such as grinding to dust
20		or other operations.

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I	2321- Establishment; program. The department sharr		
2	establish and administer a program relating to disclosure of		
3	pesticide use by any person or entity. The department shall		
4	develop a standardized reporting form.		
5	§321- Mandatory disclosure requirements. (a) Beginning		
6	July 1, 2016, all persons or entities that cultivate crops on		
7	two hundred or more acres within a single county in any calenda		
8	year shall disclose the use of all pesticides in accordance wit		
9	this section.		
10	(b) For each month of the reporting year, the person or		
11	entity shall report to the department the use of all pesticides		
12	used in the preceding month. For each use, the report shall		
13	include:		
14	(1) The pesticide's trade name, federal and state		
15	registration or permit number, commercial product		
16	name, active and inert ingredients, and gallons or		
17	pounds used;		
18	(2) The method, date, and total quantity of each		
19	application;		

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1	(3)	The geographic location of each application, by	
2		address and tax map key number, and, where	
3		appropriate, field number; and	
4	(4)	The total acreage and the area size where the	
5		pesticide was used.	
6	§321	- Public disclosure requirements. Beginning	
7	October 1	, 2016, the department shall post online on the	
8	department's website a summary of each monthly report received		
9	under this part and, for each month, the failure of any person		
10	or entity to comply with this part."		
11	SECT:	ION 2. If any provision of this Act, or the	
12	application	on thereof to any person or circumstance, is held	
13	invalid,	the invalidity does not affect other provisions or	
14	application	ons of the Act that can be given effect without the	
15	invalid pr	rovision or application, and to this end the provisions	
16	of this Act are severable.		
17	SECT	ION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
