## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

_	
1	SECTION 1. Act 54, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, enacted
2	the complete streets law, codified as section 264-20.5, Hawaii
3	Revised Statutes, to require the department of transportation
4	and the county transportation departments to adopt a complete
5	streets policy that seeks to reasonably accommodate convenient
6	access and mobility for all users of the public highways within
7	their respective jurisdictions, including pedestrians,
8	bicyclists, transit users, motorists, and persons of all ages
9	and abilities.
10	The legislature finds that clarification of the complete
11	streets policy is necessary to assure its proper implementation
12	and ensure its effectiveness as intended.
13	The purpose of this Act is to:
14	(1) Require the state department of transportation to
15	submit an annual report to the legislature detailing
16	compliance with complete streets policy and
17	principles:

1	(2)	Require the state department of transportation to	
2		establish and publish performance standards with	
3		measurable benchmarks reflecting the capacity for all	
4		users to travel safely and conveniently along state	
5		roadways;	
6	(3)	Require that the complete street policies of the State	
7		apply to new construction, reconstruction, repaving,	
8		operations, and maintenance activities;	
9	(4)	Require the state department of transportation to	
10		create a complete streets policy checklist for each	
11		project and post the checklist on its website; and	
12	(5)	Require the counties to consider complete street	
13		policies when adopting or amending land use	
14		ordinances.	
15	SECT	ION 2. Section 264-20.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
16	amended to read as follows:		
17	"[+]:	§264-20.5[+] Complete streets. (a) The department of	
18	transport	ation and the county transportation departments shall	
19	adopt a c	omplete streets policy that seeks to reasonably	
20	accommoda	te convenient access and mobility for all users of the	
21	public hig	ghways within their respective jurisdictions as

- 2 bicyclists, transit users, motorists, and persons of all ages
- 3 and abilities.
- 4 (b) This section shall apply to new construction,
- 5 reconstruction, and maintenance of highways, roads, streets,
- 6 ways, and lanes located within urban, suburban, and rural areas,
- 7 if appropriate for the application of complete streets.
- **8** (c) This section shall not apply if:
- 9 (1) Use of a particular highway, road, street, way, or
- lane by bicyclists or pedestrians is prohibited by
- law, including within interstate highway corridors;
- 12 (2) The costs would be excessively disproportionate to the
- need or probable use of the particular highway, road,
- street, way, or lane;
- 15 (3) There exists a sparseness of population, or there
- 16 exists other available means, or similar factors
- indicating an absence of a future need; or
- 18 (4) The safety of vehicular, pedestrian, or bicycle
- 19 traffic may be placed at unacceptable risk.
- 20 (d) On or before December 31, 2016, and on or before
- 21 December 31 of each year thereafter, the director of

5	(1)	A list of transportation facilities and projects
6		initiated during that fiscal year as well as the

8	(2)	Exceptions made under subsection (c);
9	(3)	Beginning July 1, 2017, measurable performance
10		standards and benchmarks, as established in
11		conjunction with the Moving Ahead for Progress in the
12		21st Century Act process applicable to each project;
13		and
14	(4)	Problems and suggested solutions, and recommendations
15		to improve the process.
16	<u>(e)</u>	The department of transportation shall establish and
17	publish p	erformance standards with measurable benchmarks
18	reflectin	g the capacity for all users to travel with appropriate
19	safety an	d convenience along roadways under the jurisdiction of
20	the State	· <u>-</u>
21	(f)	The department of transportation shall ensure that:

1	(1)	Complete streets policies of the State apply to new
2		construction, reconstruction, repaving, operations,
3		and maintenance activities;
4	(2)	A complete streets policy checklist of duties of the
5		department of transportation is published in
6		accordance with section 1-28.5. The complete streets
7		checklist shall apply from initial planning through
8		final design, construction and operation for all new
9		construction, reconstruction, and repaving surface
10		transportation initiatives. The complete streets
11		checklist shall be updated from time to time as
12		necessary to facilitate the implementation of the
13		complete streets policy. As used in this paragraph,
14		"complete streets checklist" refers to a tool to
15		collect data and information about the status of the
16		roadway and the surrounding area, as well as the
17		details of the transportation facility or project,
18		with a goal of identifying specific elements that can
19		be incorporated to support and balance the needs of
20		all users; and

1	(3)	The complete streets policy checklist with
2		accompanying documentation shall become a public
3		record and shall be accessible on the department of
4		transportation's website within sixty days of
5		completion of the checklist and accompanying
6		documentation.
7	<u>(g)</u>	In adopting or amending land use ordinances, the
8	counties	shall consider complete street policies to ensure that:
9	(1)	A context sensitive and multi-modal approach is
10		considered in ordinances;
11	(2)	Consideration is given to allow flexibility in the
12		zoning requirements; and
13	(3)	Other factors peculiar to the community are considered
14		when:
15		(A) The application of this section conflicts with
16		the context of the particular community; or
17		(B) A land use ordinance appears to conflict with the
18		principles of complete streets."
19	SECT	TON 3. The director of transportation shall provide
20	training	for the department of transportation's design,
21	operation	s, and maintenance staff in complete streets policies,

- 1 principles, and implementation procedures that may be applicable
- 2 to the performance of their duties.
- 3 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
