A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
 to read as follows:

4 "PART . TEACHING INCENTIVE PROGRAMS FOR HIGH NEED AREAS
5 §302A- Definitions. As used in this part, unless the
6 context otherwise requires:

7 "Approved course of study" means a course of study that8 leads to enrollment in a graduate education program.

9 "Approved educational institution" means a public or 10 private post-secondary educational institution located in this 11 State that has been accredited by a nationally recognized 12 accrediting agency that is listed by the United States Secretary 13 of Education.

14 "Department" means the department of education.

15 "High need area" means schools in hard-to-staff areas as16 determined by the department.



1 "Program" means the teaching incentive program established 2 under this part. "Qualified individual" means any individual who attends: 3 (1) A post-secondary educational institution located in 4 5 this State leading to a master's degree or doctoral 6 degree in education, who intends to teach in a public 7 school in a high need area in the State, and who has been a resident of this State for the previous five 8 9 years; 10 A post-secondary educational institution located (2)outside the State leading to a master's degree or 11 12 doctoral degree in education, who intends to teach in 13 a public school in a high need area in the State, and 14 has maintained residency within the State for the previous five years; or 15 A post-secondary educational institution located 16 (3) 17 outside the State leading to a master's degree or 18 doctoral degree in education, and who intends to teach 19 in a public school in a high need area in the State, 20 and whose parent maintained residency within the State 21 for the previous five years.



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"Work requirement" means teaching at a public school in a
 high need area located in the State after receiving a master's
 degree or doctoral degree in education.
 §302A- Teaching incentive program for high need areas;
 establishment, administration. (a) There is established a

6 program to be known as the teaching incentive program for high7 need areas to be placed within the department.

8 (b) Under the parameters of the program, the department
9 may provide incentives to a qualified individual who is a
10 resident of the State.

(c) To receive incentives under this part, a qualified
individual shall meet all of the following requirements:
(1) Be working toward or have a master's degree or

14 doctoral degree in education from an accredited15 college or university in the State;

16 (2) Maintenance of domicile in the State during the term17 of the incentives;

18 (3) Compliance with any conditions placed on the19 incentives by the department; and

20 (4) Enter into a written agreement with the department to:

5		determined by the department, if the teacher
6		fails to comply with this part.
7	(d) A qu	alified individual applying for incentives under

10	application shall include a verified statement of employment	
11	from the appropriate school.	
12	(e) If a	qualified individual or school terminates
13	employment or	course of study during the academic year or prior
14	to completion	of the academic year, the qualified individual
15	shall be ineli	gible for incentives as of the date of
16	termination.	The qualified individual shall become eligible for
17	incentives upor	n employment at a public school in a high need
18	area and meeti	ng the criteria set forth in this part
19	(f) Ince	ntives awarded under the program shall be limited
20	to funds approp	priated for that purpose or funds otherwise
21	matched by ext	ernal entities.

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1 §302A-**Incentives.** (a) The incentive offered under the 2 program created by this Act shall be a loan repayment program. (b) Qualified individuals shall be eligible for the 3 program to repay 10 per cent of outstanding student loans 4 entered into by qualified individuals in pursuit of a bachelor's 5 6 degree, master's degree, or doctoral degree from an approved 7 educational institution for each year of service teaching in a 8 high need area plus all interest accrued in that year. Qualified individuals shall be eligible to receive the incentive 9 10 for each year of service teaching in a high need area up to ten 11 years. 12 (c) Individuals who do not meet the definition of "qualified individual", but possess a master's degree or 13

14 doctoral degree in education and intend to teach in a public 15 school in a high need area in Hawaii shall be eligible for the 16 program to repay 5 per cent of outstanding student loans entered 17 into by the individual in pursuit of a bachelor's degree, 18 master's degree, or doctoral degree from an approved educational 19 institution for each year of service teaching in a high need 20 area, plus all interest accrued in that year. The individual



shall be eligible to receive the incentive for each year of 1 service teaching in a high need area up to ten years. 2 3 §302A-**Program administration.** (a) The department 4 shall monitor and verify an incentive recipient's fulfillment of 5 all requirements under this part. The department may enter into a contract with a 6 (b) 7 private or public entity to administer the program. 8 The department shall enforce repayment of all (C) 9 incentives for an incentive recipient who does not comply with 10 this part. Repayment shall include the use of all lawful collection procedures and the use of private collection 11 12 agencies. Incentives received by an individual for the program 13 (d) 14 shall not be considered taxable income under chapter 235. 15 Any person who knowingly or intentionally procures, (e) 16 obtains, or aids another to procure or obtain an incentive under this part through fraudulent means shall be disqualified from 17 18 participation in the program and shall be liable to the 19 department for an amount equal to three times the amount 20 obtained.

18	(b)	The annual report shall be submitted to the governor
19	and the le	egislature no later than twenty days prior to the
20	convening	of each regular session.

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1	§302A- Scholarship grants; establishment. (a) The			
2	department may provide scholarship grants to an eligible student			
3	who is a resident of the State upon confirmation that the			
4	student has been accepted for enrollment in an approved graduate			
5	course of study in education. Scholarship grants shall only be			
6	for the amounts set forth in this part and shall only be used			
7	for tuition, books, laboratory fees, and any other required			
8	fees.			
9	(b) To receive a scholarship grant under this part, a			
10	student shall meet all of the following requirements:			
11	(1) Graduation from an accredited college or university			
12	with a bachelor's degree;			
13	(2) Maintenance of domicile in Hawaii during the term of			
14	the scholarship grants;			
15	(3) Compliance with any conditions placed on the			
16	scholarship grant by the university;			
17	(4) Maintenance of a grade point average of 3.0 or higher,			
18	on a scale of 4.0 or its equivalent; and			
19	(5) Enter into a written agreement with the university to:			
20	(A) Satisfy all degree requirements and other			
21	requirements under this part;			



1	(B)	Commence instruction in a high need area of the
2		State within one year after completion of an
3		approved graduate degree in education for a
4		period of one year for each academic year the
5		student received a scholarship grant under this
6		part, unless the department determines that there
7		are extenuating circumstances; and
8	(C)	Reimburse the department for all amounts received
9		under this part and interest thereon, as
10		determined by the department, if the student
11		fails to comply with this part.
12	A student	applying for the scholarship shall apply to the
13	department and	provide the department with all the required
14	information an	d documentation to receive the scholarship. The
15	application sh	all include a verified statement of grade point
16	average from t	he university. The teaching requirement under
17	this section s	hall begin after the receipt of the master's or

18 doctoral degree in education.

(c) If a student terminates enrollment in the approved
graduate course of study during the academic year or prior to
completion of the approved graduate course of study and is

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1 eligible to have all or a portion of the tuition payments 2 refunded under the refund policies of the institution, the approved educational institution shall notify the department in 3 writing and shall return all unused portions of the scholarship 4 5 grant. Returned amounts shall be used to fund other scholarship grants under this part. A scholarship under this part is only 6 7 transferable to another approved educational institution if approved by the department. Scholarship grants awarded under 8 9 this section shall be limited to funds appropriated for that purpose or funds otherwise matched by external entities. First 10 11 priority for awarding grants shall be given to renewal 12 applicants.

13 §302A- Grant awards. (a) The department may award a 14 grant in an amount up to \$5,000 per academic year to a student 15 enrolled full-time in an approved educational institution 16 pursuing a graduate degree in education through an approved 17 course of study.

18 The grant shall be for a maximum of three academic years 19 for a master's degree or up to four academic years if the 20 student is enrolled in a doctoral program approved course of 21 study.



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1 (b) The department shall monitor and verify a student's 2 fulfillment of all requirements under this section, and may 3 enter into a contract with a private or public entity to 4 administer the program. The department shall enforce repayment 5 of all grants for a student who does not comply with this 6 section. Repayment shall include the use of all lawful 7 collection procedures and the use of private collection 8 agencies. Grants received by a student pursuant to this section 9 shall not be considered taxable income under chapter 235, and 10 shall not be considered financial assistance or appropriations 11 to the approved educational institution.

(c) Any person who knowingly or intentionally procures, obtains, or aids another to procure or obtain a grant under this part through fraudulent means shall be disqualified from participation in the program and shall be liable to the department for an amount equal to three times the amount obtained.

18 §302A- Annual reports. The department shall publish 19 reports by September 1, 2016, and every year thereafter, that 20 shall include information regarding the operation of its 21 respective programs including:

14	SECT	ION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
16	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and
17	the same	sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
18	year 2016	-2017 to establish and implement the teaching incentive
19	program for high need areas.	
20	The	sums appropriated shall be expended by the department

21 $\,$ of education for the purposes of this Act.

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1	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
3	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and
4	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
5	year 2016-2017 to establish scholarship grants for students
6	pursuing post-secondary degrees in the field of education.
7	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
8	of education for the purposes of this Act.
9	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
