# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1
- amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and 2
- 3 to read as follows:
- TEACHING INCENTIVE PROGRAMS FOR HIGH NEED AREAS 4
- 5 §302A-**Definitions.** As used in this part, unless the
- 6 context otherwise requires:
- "Approved course of study" means a course of study that 7
- leads to enrollment in a graduate education program. 8
- 9 "Approved educational institution" means a public or
- 10 private post-secondary educational institution located in this
- State that has been accredited by a nationally recognized 11
- accrediting agency that is listed by the United States Secretary 12
- of Education. 13
- 14 "Department" means the department of education.
- 15 "High need area" means schools in hard-to-staff areas as
- 16 determined by the department.
- 17 "Program" means the teaching incentive program established
- 18 under this part.

- (1) A post-secondary educational institution located in this State leading to a master's degree or doctoral degree in education, who intends to teach in a public school in a high need area in the State, and who has been a resident of this State for the previous five years;

- 6 degree, master's degree, or doctoral degree from an approved
- 7 educational institution for each year of service teaching in a

- 9 Qualified individuals shall be eligible to receive the incentive
- 10 for each year of service teaching in a high need area up to ten
- 11 years.
