A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE PLANNING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii State 2 Planning Act was enacted in 1978 to improve the planning process 3 and guide future development of the State. The Hawaii State 4 Planning Act sets forth the Hawaii state plan, which articulates 5 goals and policies to guide the development of the State and 6 establishes an integrated planning and implementation system 7 regarding those goals and policies. The last review of the 8 Hawaii State Planning Act was initiated in 1983 and completed in
- 9 1985 and resulted in several amendments to the Hawaii State
- 10 Planning Act. Since then, there have been significant changes
- 11 in Hawaii's economic, physical, and social conditions;
- 12 technology; and the global marketplace. The State also faces
- 13 new constraints and opportunities as it plans for the future.
- 14 Thus, the legislature finds that a comprehensive review of the
- 15 Hawaii State Planning Act, codified as chapter 226, Hawaii
- 16 Revised Statutes, is now warranted.

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- 1 The purpose and intent of this Act is to review and update
- 2 the Hawaii State Planning Act and continue efforts to develop
- 3 goals and policies to guide the development of the State.
- 4 Specifically, this Act requires and provides funding for the
- 5 office of planning, among other things, to review the Hawaii
- 6 State Planning Act and report to the legislature its
- 7 recommendations for updating the Hawaii State Planning Act to
- 8 appropriately address the needs of the State.
- 9 SECTION 2. (a) The office of planning shall review the
- 10 Hawaii state plan as set forth in the Hawaii State Planning Act
- 11 for the purpose of making recommendations for amendments to
- 12 update the plan in response to current state needs.
- 13 Specifically, the office of planning shall further the intent
- 14 and purpose of the Hawaii State Planning Act by, among other
- 15 things:
- 16 (1) Providing recommendations on conflicts between the
- 17 Hawaii State Planning Act, county plans, functional
- 18 plans, and state programs;
- 19 (2) Reviewing major plans, programs, projects, and
- 20 regulatory activities proposed by state and county

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1		agencies and providing advisory opinions and reports
2		to the governor, as needed;
3	(3)	Analyzing existing state policies, planning and
4		program operations, laws, rules, and practices
5		relative to the formation, implementation, and
6		coordination of the state plan;
7	(4)	Reviewing state capital improvement projects;
8	(5)	Identifying and analyzing significant issues, emerging
9		issues, problems, and opportunities confronting the
10		State, and formulating strategies and alternative
11		courses of action in response to the identified
12		problems and opportunities; and
13	(6)	Soliciting and reviewing proposals for amendments to
14		the Hawaii State Planning Act from the general public
15		in accordance with section 226-54, Hawaii Revised
16		Statutes.
17	(b)	Not later than thirty days prior to the convening of
18	the regula	ar session of 2017, the office of planning shall submit
19	a written	report to the legislature of its findings and
20	recommenda	ations, including any proposed legislation, regarding

- 1 its review and proposed updates to the Hawaii State Planning
- 2 Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 6 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 7 2016-2017 for reviewing and proposing updates to the Hawaii
- 8 State Planning Act.
- 9 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 10 planning for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
