Provided that of the general fund 4 appropriation for general administration (LBR902), the sum of 5 $[\$450,000_T]$ \$200,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary for 6 fiscal year 2014-2015, shall be expended for the purpose of 7 8 accrued vacation payments for all employees leaving the employ 9 of the department of labor and industrial relations; provided 10 further that the department shall first make payments from the 11 vacation payout allocation before expending funds from turnover and vacancy amounts; provided further that the respective non-12 13 general fund shall reimburse the general fund for any payments made for accrued vacation payments; and provided further that 14 any unexpended funds shall lapse to the general fund at the end 15

of the fiscal year for which the appropriation was made."
