BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 134, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§134- Possession of a loaded firearm while intoxicated.
5	(a) It shall be unlawful for a person to recklessly possess a
6	loaded firearm while the person is intoxicated.
7	(b) For the purposes of this section, a person is in
8	possession of a loaded firearm when the person has direct
9	physical control over a loaded firearm or has both the power and
10	the intention to exercise control over a loaded firearm;
11	provided that:
12	(1) Possession may be shared; and
13	(2) The mere fact of proximity or access to a place where
14	a loaded firearm may be found is insufficient, by
15	itself, to establish possession.
16	(c) For the purposes of this section, a person is
17	intoxicated if the person is under a disturbance of mental or

- 2 substances into the person's body; provided that intoxication is
- 3 not, by itself, a mental disease or defect.
- 4 (d) Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a
- 5 petty misdemeanor punishable by up to thirty days imprisonment,
- 6 a fine of not more than \$1,000, or both."
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 9 begun before its effective date.
- 10 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
