A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The legislature finds that community health
2	centers s	erve uninsured, underinsured, low-income patient
3	populatio	ns with demographic complexities and co-morbidities, in
4	addition	to one-fourth of the State's medicaid members, and many
5	of the State's homeless individuals and families. Community	
6	health centers:	
7	(1)	Are nonprofit, community-based organizations whose
8		purpose and expertise lie in providing quality,
9		person-centered health care to underserved populations
10		and areas;
11	(2)	Provide culturally and linguistically appropriate
12		health care and a broad range of integrated primary
13		care and preventative services;
14	(3)	Operate in medically underserved areas where people
15		have limited access to other health care providers
16		because of geographic and socio-economic barriers;
17	(4)	Contribute greatly to the economies and livability of
18		the communities they serve; and

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1	(5) Are cost-effective, quality health care providers		
2	whose care results in healthier patients and decreased		
3	use of emergency, specialty, and in-patient services.		
4	Community health centers save the health care system \$1,26		
5	per patient per year due to timely, effective care and care		
6	management that reduce unnecessary emergency room, in-patient,		
7	and specialty utilization, which translated to savings of more		
8	than \$90,000,000 for Hawaii's medicaid program in 2013.		
9	Community health centers offer patient-centered delivery systems		
10	that feature comprehensive primary medical, behavioral health,		
11	and dental services; provide care management and enabling		
12	services that enhance access, compliance, and patient		
13	engagement; and focus on quality outcomes supported by		
14	electronic health records that conform to meaningful use		
15	requirements. Community health centers are a smart investment		
16	that result in healthier communities while saving the State		
17	money.		
18	Implementation of the Patient Protection and Affordable		
19	Care Act has resulted in uncertainty for many individuals and		
20	presents challenges for those individuals to obtain health		
21	insurance. Overall, about twenty per cent of health center		

- 1 patients remain uninsured, and some health centers have even
- 2 larger percentages of uninsured patient populations. For these
- 3 reasons, it is imperative that the State provide support and
- 4 resources to health centers so that uninsured individuals have
- 5 access to primary medical, dental, and behavioral health care
- 6 services that prevent unnecessary or inappropriate use of the
- 7 emergency room and minimize uncompensated health care costs and
- 8 state expenditures arising from treatment for preventable
- 9 injuries and illnesses.
- 10 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate
- 11 funds to provide quality, cost-effective direct health care for
- 12 uninsured and underinsured patients at community health centers.
- 13 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$6,000,000 or so much
- 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 16 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 17 2016-2017 for direct health care, which may include primary
- 18 medical, dental, and behavioral health care, for the uninsured
- 19 and underinsured patients at community health centers; provided
- 20 that distribution of funds may be on a "per visit" basis and may

- 1 include an additional per member per month quality incentive
- 2 payment that takes into consideration need in all counties.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 4 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
