A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 The legislature finds that community health SECTION 1. 2 centers serve uninsured, underinsured, low income patient populations with demographic complexities and co-morbidities, in 3 addition to one-fourth of the State's medicaid members, and many 4 of the State's homeless individuals and families. Community 5 6 health centers are nonprofit, community-based organizations whose purpose and expertise lie in providing quality, person-7 centered health care to underserved populations and areas. 8 Community health centers: 9 10 (1)Provide culturally and linguistically appropriate health care and a broad range of integrated primary 11 care and preventive services; 12 Operate in medically-underserved areas where people 13 (2) have limited access to other health care providers 14 because of geographic and socio-economic barriers; 15
- 16 (3) Contribute greatly to the economies and livability of 17 the communities they serve; and

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1	(4) Provide cost-effective quality health care which
2	results in healthier patients and decreased use of
3	emergency, specialty, and in-patient services.
4	Community health centers save the health care system \$1,263
5	per patient per year due to timely, effective care and care
6	management that reduces unnecessary emergency room, in-patient,
7	and specialty utilization. In 2013, this translated to savings
8	of more than \$90,000,000 for Hawaii's medicaid program.
9	Community health centers' patient-centered delivery system
10	features: comprehensive primary medical, behavioral health, and
11	dental services; care management and enabling services that
12	enhance access, compliance, and patient engagement; and focus on
13	quality outcomes supported by electronic health records that
14	conform to meaningful use requirements. Community health
15	centers are a smart investment that result in healthier
16	communities while saving the State money.
17	Implementation of the Patient Protection and Affordable
18	Care Act has resulted in uncertainty for many individuals and
19	presented challenges for those individuals to obtain health
20	insurance. Overall, about 20 per cent of health center patients
21	remain uninsured, and some health centers have even larger

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- 1 percentages of uninsured patient populations. For these
- 2 reasons, it is imperative that the State provide support and
- 3 resources to health centers so that uninsured individuals have
- 4 access to primary, dental, and behavioral health care services
- 5 that prevent unnecessary or inappropriate use of the emergency
- 6 room and uncompensated health care costs.
- 7 The legislature finds that it is in the best interests of
- 8 the State to ensure access to primary, behavioral, dental, and
- 9 preventive health care for its residents. In addition to
- 10 facilitating a healthier population, improving access to health
- 11 care reduces state expenditures attributable to hospital and
- 12 emergency room services for preventable injuries or illnesses.
- 13 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to provide quality,
- 14 cost-effective health care for Hawaii residents who are
- 15 uninsured, newly uninsured, or underinsured.
- 16 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$6,000,000 or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 19 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 20 2016-2017 for the provision of direct health care by federally
- 21 qualified community health centers for the uninsured and

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- 1 underinsured, which may include primary medical, dental, and
- 2 behavioral health care; provided that distribution of funds may
- 3 be on a per visit basis, and may include an additional per
- 4 member per month quality incentive payment, taking into
- 5 consideration need on all islands.
- 6 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
