A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DISPOSITION OF TAX REVENUES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that budgetary planning
2	and transparency are key components to ensuring the ongoing
3	fiscal health of the State.
4	By establishing maximum amounts for distribution among the
5	non-general funds, the legislature intends that this Act:
6	. (1) Make forecasts of general fund revenues more reliable;
7	(2) Increase legislative oversight of the agencies and
8	programs supported by the non-general funds; and
9	(3) Subject those agencies and programs to competition for
10	limited public funds if the agencies or programs want
11	more than the amount automatically distributed to
12	their non-general funds.
13	The purpose of this Act is to address budgetary planning
14	and transparency in the disposition of conveyance tax revenues
15	by:
16	(1) Setting maximum amounts to be distributed to various
17	non-general funds from the conveyance tax; and

1	(2)	Appropriating general lunds to provide continued
2		support of programs either similar to or previously
3		supported by distributions to the natural area reserve
4		fund and its associated programs from conveyance tax
5		revenues.
6	SECTI	ON 2. Section 195F-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by	amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
8	"(a)	There is established a special fund within the state
9	treasury k	nown as the forest stewardship fund which shall be
10	used as fo	llows:
11	(1)	Payments shall be made by the board pursuant to
12		agreements entered into with qualified landowners to
13		further the purposes of this chapter; and
14	(2)	Moneys collected from:
15		(A) The harvest of non-native forest products from
16		forest reserves;
17		(B) The harvest of native forest products from
18		degraded forests as defined in section 186-5.5,
19		within forest reserves;
20		(C) The sale of forest products found dead and lying
21		on the ground;

1		(D)	The sale of tree seedlings from state nurseries;
2		(E)	The sale of any other products or services, or
3			anything of value derived from forest reserves
4			not described above; or
5		(F)	The imposition of fines or penalties for

8		shal	l be used for: (i) replanting, managing, and
9		main	taining designated timber management areas; (ii)
10		enha	ncing the management of public forest reserves
11		with	an emphasis on restoring degraded koa forests;

13		trai	ning programs pertaining to sustainable forestry;
14		prov	ided that the activities described in clauses (ii)
15		and	(iii) may not be funded unless the activities

18	(3)	Mone	ys deposited into the fund as authorized by
19		sect	ion 247-7 may also be used by the department to
20		admi	nister the program and manage the forest reserve
21		syst	em]."

9		watershed management plans negotiated with
10		private landowners, and management of the natural
11		area reserves system pursuant to section 195-3;
12		and
13	(C)	The youth conservation corps established under
14		chapter 193]."
15	SECTION 4	. All remaining moneys deposited into the forest
16	stewardship fu	nd, established pursuant to section 195F-4, Hawaii
17	Revised Statut	es, in accordance with section 247-7, Hawaii
18	Revised Statut	es, as of the effective date of this Act, may
19	continue to be	used for the administration of forest stewardship
20	programs and t	he management of the forest reserve system.

1	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$7,556,128 or so much
3	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
4	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
5	2016-2017 to fund positions and other operating expenditures in
6	natural area reserves and watershed management (LNR407);
7	provided that funds appropriated in this section may be
8	transferred with the approval of the governor to natural area
9	reserves and watershed management (LNR407) in the General
10	Appropriations Act of 2015 (House Bill No. 500, H.D. 1, S.D. 1,
11	C.D. 1) for expenditure. The appropriations of this section
12	shall be expended for the following:
13	(1) Natural area partnership and forest stewardship
14	programs after joint consultation with the forest
15	stewardship committee and the natural area reserves
16	system commission;
17	(2) Projects undertaken in accordance with watershed
18	management plans pursuant to section 171-58, Hawaii
19	Revised Statutes, or watershed management plans
20	negotiated with private landowners, and management of

1	the natural area reserves system pursuant to section
2	195-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and
3	(3) The youth conservation corps established under chapter
4	193, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
5	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
6	of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
7	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
8	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,832,996 or so much
9	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
10	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
11	2016-2017 to fund positions and other operating expenditures in
12	forestry - resource management and development (LNR172) for
13	forest reserve management, natural area partnership, and forest
14	stewardship programs after joint consultation with the forest
15	stewardship committee and the natural area reserves system
16	commission; provided that funds appropriated in this section may
17	be transferred with the approval of the governor to forestry -
18	resource management and development (LNR172) in the General
19	Appropriations Act of 2015 (House Bill No. 500, H.D. 1, S.D. 1,
20	C.D. 1) for expenditure.

- 21 2016-2017 for the native resources and fire protection program

- 1 (LNR402) for fire, natural disaster, and emergency response
- 2 equipment and other current expenses of the native resources and
- 3 fire protection program.
- 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 5 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$4,000,000 or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 9 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 10 2016-2017 for the native resources and fire protection program
- 11 (LNR402) to be expended as directed by the Hawaii invasive
- 12 species council for invasive species programs statewide;
- 13 provided that portions of this appropriation may be transferred
- 14 to other state departments to implement the directions of the
- 15 invasive species council.
- 16 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 17 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 18 SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 21 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year

- 1 2016-2017 for LNR natural and physical environment (LNR906)
- 2 for the Kahoolawe island reserve commission.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 4 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$101,715 or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 8 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 9 2016-2017 to fund positions and other expenditures in LNR -
- 10 natural and physical environment (LNR906) for administrative
- 11 operating expenses; provided that funds appropriated in this
- 12 section may be transferred with the approval of the governor to
- 13 LNR natural and physical environment (LNR906) in the General
- 14 Appropriations Act of 2015 (House Bill No. 500, H.D. 1, S.D. 1,
- 15 C.D. 1) for expenditure.
- 16 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 17 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 18 SECTION 12. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$350,000 or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 21 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year

- 1 2016-2017 for the funding of soil and water conservation
- 2 districts in water and land development (LNR141).
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 4 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 13. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$76,260 or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 8 sum of \$152,520 or so much thereof as may be necessary for
- 9 fiscal year 2016-2017 for the funding of the following positions
- 10 to support the implementation of the Hawaii ocean resources
- 11 management plan in ecosystem protection and restoration
- **12** (LNR401):
- 13 Six-Month Salary Twelve-Month Salary
- 14 Position Fiscal Year 2015-16 Fiscal Year 2016-17
- 15 1.0 FTE planner IV \$23,700 \$47,400

- 18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 19 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 20 SECTION 14. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 15. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
