A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TAXATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 571-46.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§571-46.1 Joint custody. (a) Upon the application of
- 4 either parent, joint custody may be awarded in the discretion of
- 5 the court. For the purpose of assisting the court in making a
- 6 determination whether an award of joint custody is appropriate,
- 7 the court shall, upon the request of either party, direct that
- 8 an investigation be conducted pursuant to the provisions of
- 9 section 571-46(a)(4).
- (b) For the purposes of this section, "joint custody"
- 11 means an order awarding legal custody of the minor child or
- 12 children to both parents and providing that physical custody
- 13 shall be shared by the parents, pursuant to a parenting plan
- 14 developed pursuant to section 571-46.5, in such a way as to
- 15 assure the child or children of frequent, continuing, and
- 16 meaningful contact with both parents; provided, however, that

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- 1 such order may award joint legal custody without awarding joint
- 2 physical custody.
- 3 (c) Any order for joint custody may be modified or
- terminated upon the petition of one or both parents or on the 4
- court's own motion if it is shown that the best interests of the 5
- child require modification or termination of the order. 6
- 7 Any order for the custody of the minor child or
- 8 children of a marriage entered by a court in this State or any
- other state may, subject to the jurisdictional requirements set 9
- 10 forth in sections 583A-201 to 583A-204, be modified at any time
- 11 to an order of joint custody in accordance with this section.
- 12 (e) Any order for joint custody may be used by each parent
- in alternating taxable years to designate the child, regardless 13
- of physical custody, as a qualifying individual under section 14
- 15 235-55.6."
- 16 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act, upon its approval, shall apply to
- 18 taxable years beginning after December 31, 2014.
