BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	TON 1. Chapter 291E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to re	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§29</u>	1E- Motor vehicle seizure and impoundment. (a)
5	When a la	w enforcement officer arrests, or issues a summons or
6	citation	to, an operator of a motor vehicle for:
7	(1)	Operating a vehicle under the influence of an
8		intoxicant, as provided in section 291E-61;
9	(2)	Habitually operating a vehicle under the influence of
10		an intoxicant, as provided in section 291E-61.5;
11	(3)	Operating a vehicle after license and privilege have
12		been suspended or revoked for operating a vehicle
13		under the influence of an intoxicant, as provided in
14		section 291E-62; or
15	(4)	Operating a vehicle after consuming a measurable
16		amount of alcohol as provided in section 291E-64;

3	SECTION 2. Section 291C-165.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
5	"(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter,
6	any vehicle identified for removal pursuant to any county
7	ordinance or section 291E- ordering or authorizing removal of
8	motor vehicles by any county police department for traffic
9	violations, including a vehicle [which] that constitutes an
10	obstruction or hazard to traffic, may be towed away at the
11	expense of the registered owner of the vehicle, as provided by
12	this section."
13	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
