A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH CONNECTOR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the federal Patient
- 2 Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010 (Affordable Care Act)
- 3 required states to establish health insurance exchanges to
- 4 connect buyers and sellers of health and dental insurance and
- 5 facilitate the purchase and sale of federally qualified health
- 6 insurance plans and qualified dental plans. Hawaii's health
- 7 insurance exchange, known as the Hawaii health connector
- 8 (connector), stated in its January 2015 annual report that it is
- 9 on the path to financial self-sustainability and could reach a
- 10 surplus by 2022. However, increased engagement and
- 11 participation by insurers in the connector will be a critical
- 12 factor to increase enrollment and achieve self-sustainability as
- 13 quickly as possible.
- 14 The legislature further finds that the Affordable Care Act
- 15 allows states to elect to permit the sale of fully-insured large
- 16 group health plans through state health exchanges. If a state
- 17 chooses this option, the same insurance market reforms that

- 1 currently apply to fully-insured group health plans purchased by
- 2 small employers will apply to the fully-insured large group
- 3 health insurance market. Enabling the Hawaii health connector
- 4 to offer large group coverage to insurers is one option for
- 5 increased insurer participation in the connector.
- 6 The legislature also finds that states currently have the
- 7 option to permit health insurers to continue certain insurance
- 8 policies that would otherwise be canceled due to the
- 9 requirements of the Affordable Care Act. These transitional
- 10 renewal policies, also known as grandmothered health plans, do
- 11 not contain some of the features required by the Affordable Care
- 12 Act but are not considered out of compliance with the Act, if
- 13 specific conditions are met. States may elect to allow insurers
- 14 to offer these plans through policy years beginning on or before
- 15 October 1, 2016, but no later.
- 16 The legislature further finds that under the federal
- 17 Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 (COBRA),
- 18 employers sponsoring group health plans to covered employees
- 19 must provide an initial notice about the ability to continue
- 20 insurance coverage under COBRA. The federal Department of Labor
- 21 also requires employers covered by the Fair Labor Standards Act

- 1 to provide written notice to employees about potential insurance
- 2 coverage available through state health insurance marketplaces.
- 3 Requiring health insurers to provide notice about the connector
- 4 will therefore ensure that more people are aware of their health
- 5 insurance options under COBRA and the connector.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 7 (1) Enable the Hawaii health connector to offer large 8 group coverage to insurers;
- 9 (2) End the issuance or renewal of transitional renewal policies after October 1, 2016; and
- 11 (3) Require health insurers to provide notice to group

 12 health plans offering continuation coverage about

 13 options to secure affordable coverage under the Hawaii

 14 health connector.
- 15 SECTION 2. Chapter 435H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended by adding three new sections to be appropriately
- 17 designated and to read as follows:
- 18 "\$435H- Large group coverage. Beginning on January 1,
- 19 2016, the State shall allow the connector to offer large group
- 20 coverage to insurers, as permitted in section 1312(f)(2)(b) of
- 21 the Federal Act.

1 Transitional renewal policies. Beginning October §435H-2 1, 2016, the State shall cease permitting transitional renewal 3 policies issued by insurers; provided that any transitional 4 renewal policy issued on or before October 1, 2016, shall remain 5 in effect until the date of termination of the transitional policy. All policies issued or renewed after October 1, 2016, 6 7 shall be in compliance with the Federal Act, including the 8 requirements of sections 2701, 2702, 2703, 2704, 2705, 2706, 9 2707, and 2709 of the Federal Public Health Service Act. 10 §435H- Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act; 11 notification. In addition to the requirements under the federal 12 Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985, all insurers shall provide notice to group health plans that offer 13 14 continuation coverage to employees, former employees, spouses, 15 former spouses, and dependent children regarding options to 16 secure affordable coverage through the connector, including the 17 official website, telephone number, similar health insurance 18 plans, and the availability of advance premium tax credits and 19 cost-sharing reductions." 20 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.
