A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE AFFORDABLE CARE ACT INNOVATION WAIVER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Act 158, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, 2 established a state innovation waiver task force to develop a 3 health care reform plan that meets the requirements for 4 obtaining a state innovation waiver that complies with the 5 federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, Public Law 6 111-148 (ACA). The plan to be developed by the task force for 7 the waiver is expected to build on the success of chapter 393, 8 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Prepaid Health Care Act. The task 9 force, which is to be dissolved on June 30, 2017, is temporarily 10 attached to the office of the governor for administrative 11 purposes.

12 In accordance with the terms of the ACA, an approvable 13 waiver must include:

14 (1) Coverage that is at least as comprehensive as the
15 coverage defined in section 1302(b) of the ACA and
16 offered through exchanges;



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1	(2)) Coverage and cost-sharing protections against		
2		excessive out-of-pocket spending that are at least as		
3		affordable;		
4	(3)	Coverage for at least as many residents; and		
5	(4)	Terms that will not increase the federal deficit.		
6	The major tasks for waiver development include:			
7	(1)	Identification of specific ACA provisions that Hawaii		
8		seeks to waive;		
9	(2)	Actuarial analysis and actuarial certifications of		
10		required comparability;		
11	(3)	An economic analysis of the costs and effect on the		
12		federal deficit;		
13	(4)	Development of a ten-year budget;		
14	(5)	Analysis of the impact on health insurance coverage;		
15	(6)	Public hearings; and		
16	(7)	Explicit legislative approval.		
17	The purpose of this Act is to provide the resources needed			
18	to develop an ACA waiver in a timely manner.			
19	SECTION 2. Act 158, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, is			
20	amended by amending section 2 as follows:			
21	(1)	By amending subsection (c) to read:

10		affordable insurance coverage for uninsured and		
11		underinsured individuals in Hawaii through brokers and		
12		professional employer organizations that include		
13		innovations to the State's existing medicaid program;		
14		and		
15	(4)	Develop] <u>develop</u> a plan for applying for a state		
16		innovation waiver that meets the requirements of		
17		Section 1332 of the federal act, including:		
18		[(A)] <u>(1)</u> Developing a strategy for health care		
19		reform that:

2			comprehensive as required by the federal

4		[(ii)]	(B) Provides coverage and cost-sharing

21	2.	By amending	subsection (f) to read:



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1 "(f) The task force shall submit an initial interim report 2 to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the 3 convening of the regular session of 2015. The task force shall 4 submit a second interim report to the legislature no later than 5 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2016. The interim reports shall include [+ 6 7 (1) Identification] identification of opportunities for 8 state agencies to collaborate on new information 9 technology that will advance the goals of the federal 10 act and state innovation[; and 11 (2) Recommendations on the allocation of existing moneys available for health reform and innovation, including 12 13 any proposed legislation]." 14 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the 17 sum of S or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for expenses related to developing a 18 19 federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act waiver. 20 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of 21 the governor for the purposes of this Act.

3 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
