## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROJECT KEALAHOU.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that despite intervention
- 2 efforts, girls are at greater risk than boys for sexual abuse,
- 3 running away, truancy, suicide, prostitution, and further
- 4 victimization. Moreover, many teen girls face immense
- 5 challenges brought on by unplanned pregnancy. According to the
- 6 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, pregnancy and birth
- 7 are significant contributors to high school dropout rates among
- 8 girls. These and other challenges require interventions
- 9 tailored to the unique psychosocial and interpersonal
- 10 characteristics of girls.
- 11 Project Kealahou was developed in response to broad
- 12 recognition by leaders and workers in the State's public youth
- 13 service system that adolescent girls face challenges that
- 14 established treatment programs do not adequately address. This
- 15 six-year, federally-funded program, housed in the department of
- 16 health child and adolescent mental health division, promotes
- 17 community-based, individualized, culturally- and linguistically-
- 18 competent, family-driven, youth-guided, and evidence-based



- 1 services. In addition to these standard system of care
- 2 principles, Project Kealahou emphasizes gender-responsive and
- 3 trauma-informed care when serving its target population of
- 4 adolescent females ages eleven through twenty-one who have
- 5 experienced significant trauma in their lives.
- 6 Project Kealahou also offers a relatively low-cost array of
- 7 community-based services and supports that provide cost-
- 8 effective deterrents and alternatives to more expensive and
- 9 disruptive out-of-home placements for youth, as well as a range
- 10 of cultural and recreational community-based group activities to
- 11 help youth and their families reconnect with each other and
- 12 their communities.
- 13 The legislature finds that federal funding of Project
- 14 Kealahou will phase out in October 2015, and that state funding
- 15 is needed to continue and expand this cost-effective array of
- 16 services to at-risk youth and their families who would otherwise
- 17 not have access to these services. While Project Kealahou
- 18 services are currently available throughout Oahu, ideally these
- 19 services would be expanded to extend to the entire State. With
- 20 legislative funding for Project Kealahou, much-needed services

- 1 will also be offered on the islands of Hawaii and Kauai in
- 2 fiscal year 2015-2016.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for Project
- 4 Kealahou to ensure that the array of community-based, outpatient
- 5 services and supports offered by this program are continued and
- 6 expanded to meet the needs of at-risk youth, particularly
- 7 adolescent females, and their families.
- 8 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 for the
- 11 continued funding of Project Kealahou within the child and
- 12 adolescent mental health division of the department of health.
- 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 14 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 3. The child and adolescent mental health division
- 16 of the department of health shall annually submit a report to
- 17 the legislature that shall include the following information on
- 18 the Project Kealahou program:
- 19 (1) Program outcomes;
- 20 (2) The sustainability of funding for the program; and

- (3) Any plans and recommendations to secure financial
  support for the program.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
