A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PSYCHOLOGY.

 articulated by the most current Model for Comprehensive and

- **12** National Association of School Psychologists or its successor. 13 "School psychologist" means a professional licensed by the 14 department as a school psychologist who provides school 15 psychological services consistent with the national standards 16 articulated by the most current Model for Comprehensive and 17 Integrated School Psychological Services as published by the 18 National Association of School Psychologists or its successor. 19 "School psychologist" includes a school psychologist-doctoral
