A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOTING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 2 by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
- 3 designated and to read as follows:
- 4 "§11-A Automatic registration. (a) Any person who is
- 5 eligible to vote under this part and properly completes and
- 6 submits an application for a new or renewed motor vehicle
- 7 driver's license, provisional license, or instruction permit; or
- 8 civil identification card shall automatically be registered to
- 9 vote as provided in subsection (c).
- 10 (b) The examiner of drivers of each county shall use
- 11 application forms for an original, duplicate, or change of
- 12 address driver's license, provisional license, instruction
- 13 permit, or a civil identification card as voter registration
- 14 applications. The forms shall contain spaces for all
- 15 information collected by voter registration applications as
- 16 required by section 11-15(a). The examiner of drivers of each

county shall transmit the information to the clerk of the county 1 2 in which the applicant resides. (c) The clerk shall determine whether the applicant is 3 4 currently registered in the general county register. If the 5 applicant is not currently registered, the clerk shall determine 6 whether the applicant is eighteen years of age or older and a 7 citizen of the United States. If the applicant is less than 8 eighteen years of age, the clerk shall defer the applicant until 9 the applicant reaches eighteen years of age to determine whether the applicant is eligible to vote. Upon determination that the 10 applicant is eligible to vote, the clerk shall number the 11 applicant's voter information and register the name of the voter 12 in the general county register as provided in section 11-14." 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 15 amended by adding a new section to part VI to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 16 "§286-A Voter registration. (a) A qualified applicant 17 for a motor vehicle driver's license, provisional license, or 18 19 instruction permit shall automatically be registered to vote with the clerk of the appropriate county upon completion of an 20

- 1 application for a driver's license, provisional license, or
- 2 instruction permit as required in section 11-A.
- 3 (b) Every qualified applicant identified in subsection (a)
- 4 shall be required to authorize the examiner of drivers to
- 5 collect and transmit the necessary personal information required
- 6 for registering the qualified applicant with the county clerk.
- 7 The examiner of drivers shall notify all qualified applicants
- 8 identified in subsection (a) that by submitting an application
- 9 for a driver's license, provisional license, or instruction
- 10 permit, the qualified applicant is consenting to the automatic
- 11 registration to vote with the county clerk.
- (c) For the purposes of this section, "qualified
- 13 applicant" means a person who qualifies to register as a voter
- 14 pursuant to section 11-15."
- 15 SECTION 3. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by adding a new section to part XVI to be appropriately
- 17 designated and to read as follows:
- 18 "S286-B Voter registration. (a) A qualified applicant
- 19 for a new, renewed, or duplicate identification card shall
- 20 automatically be registered to vote with the clerk of the

- 1 appropriate county upon completion of an application for an
- 2 identification card as required by section 286-303.
- 3 (b) Every qualified applicant identified in subsection (a)
- 4 shall be required to authorize the examiner of drivers to
- 5 collect and transmit the necessary personal information required
- 6 for registering the qualified applicant with the county clerk.
- 7 The examiner of drivers shall notify all qualified applicants
- 8 identified in subsection (a) that by submitting an application
- 9 for a new, renewed, or duplicate identification card, the
- 10 qualified applicant is consenting to the automatic registration
- 11 to vote with the county clerk.
- (c) For the purposes of this section, "qualified
- 13 applicant" means a person who qualifies to register as a voter
- 14 pursuant to section 11-15."
- 15 SECTION 4. Section 286-108, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 17 "(a) Except as provided in section 286-107.5(a), the
- 18 examiner of drivers shall examine every applicant for a driver's
- 19 license, except as otherwise provided in this part. The
- 20 examination shall include a test of:

1	(1)	The applicant's eyesight and any further physical
2		examination that the examiner of drivers finds
3		necessary to determine the applicant's fitness to
4		operate a motor vehicle safely upon the highways;
5	(2)	The applicant's ability to understand highway signs
6		regulating, warning, and directing traffic;
7	(3)	The applicant's knowledge of the rules of the road
8		based on the traffic laws of the State and the traffic
9		ordinances of the county where the applicant resides
10		or intends to operate a motor vehicle; provided that
11		the examination shall specifically test the
12	•	applicant's knowledge of the provisions of section
13		291C-121.5 and section 291C-137; and
14	(4)	The actual demonstration of ability to exercise
15		ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of a
16		motor vehicle.
17	The exami	nations shall be appropriate to the operation of the
18	category	of motor vehicle for which the applicant seeks to be
19	licensed	and shall be conducted as required by the director.
20	The	examiner of drivers shall require every applicant to
21	comply wi	th section 286-102.5.

1 The examiner of drivers may waive the actual demonstration 2 of ability to operate a motorcycle or motor scooter for any 3 person who furnishes evidence, to the satisfaction of the 4 examiner of drivers, that the person has completed the 5 motorcycle education course approved by the director in accordance with section 431:10G-104. 6 7 [At the time of examination, an application for voter 8 registration by mail shall be made available to every applicant 9 for a driver's license.] 10 For the purposes of this section, the term "applicant" does 11 not include any person reactivating a license under section 12 286-107.5(a)." 13 SECTION 5. Section 286-311, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: [All] Except as provided in sections 286-A and 286-B, 15 16 information and records acquired by the examiner of drivers 17 under this part shall be confidential. All information and 18 records shall be maintained in an appropriate form and in an 19 appropriate office in the custody and under the control of the 20 examiner. The information shall be available only to authorized 21 individuals under such restrictions as the director shall

- 1 prescribe. The examiner may dispose of any application or
- 2 identification card, or information or record relating to the
- 3 application or identification card, which does not include a
- 4 social security number, without regard to chapter 94, whenever,
- 5 in the examiner's discretion, retention of the information or
- 6 record is no longer required or practicable."
- 7 SECTION 6. In codifying the new sections added by sections
- 8 1 to 3 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 9 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 10 the new sections in this Act.
- 11 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 13 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
