
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RESISTING AN ORDER TO STOP A VEHICLE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that existing law in the
- 2 penal code does not adequately address situations in which an
- 3 offender, while fleeing in a vehicle from a law enforcement
- 4 officer, places another person in danger of being injured or
- 5 damages property. The offender may be arrested for the offense
- 6 of attempted murder, assault in the second degree, or
- 7 terroristic threatening in the first degree. However, the
- 8 alleged conduct does not fulfill the elements of those offenses,
- 9 which causes the charges to be changed or dropped. The
- 10 offender's intent is not to commit murder, assault, or
- 11 terroristic threatening or to damage the property of another.
- 12 Rather, the offender is trying to elude apprehension while
- 13 fleeing in a vehicle.
- 14 The legislature further finds that police officers
- 15 frequently attempt to make vehicular traffic stops, which causes
- 16 the offender to speed away. In the process of fleeing in a
- 17 vehicle, an innocent bystander may be placed in danger of being

1	injured or property may be damaged. Over the past several
2	years, such dangerous encounters have become common place. This
3	is a very dangerous situation for the law enforcement officer,
4	the offender, and other people in the area, because an offender
5	can easily lose control of the vehicle being operated at a high
6	speed and injure or kill someone.
7	The legislature further finds that creating a new felony
8	offense of resisting an order to stop a motor vehicle provides
9	the prosecution with an additional offense to charge an offender
10	fleeing a stop in a motor vehicle. In addition, the safety of
11	police officers and bystanders would be enhanced.
12	The purpose of this Act is to:
13	(1) Establish the offense of resisting an order to stop a
14	motor vehicle in the first degree as a class C felony
15	and
16	(2) Reclassify the existing offense of resisting an order
17	to stop a motor vehicle, a misdemeanor, to resisting
18	an order to stop a motor vehicle in the second degree
19	SECTION 2. Chapter 710, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20	amended by adding a new section to part III to be appropriately
21	designated and to read as follows:

1	"§710- Resisting an order to stop a motor vehicle in th
2	first degree. (1) A person commits the offense of resisting a
3	order to stop a motor vehicle in the first degree if the person
4	intentionally fails to obey a direction of a law enforcement
5	officer, acting under color of the law enforcement officer's
6	official authority, to stop the person's vehicle and in the
7	process of doing so, the person negligently:
8	(a) Places another person in danger of death or bodily
9	injury;
10	(b) Causes bodily injury to another person; or
11	(c) Damages the property of another person.
12	(2) Resisting an order to stop a motor vehicle in the
13	first degree is a class C felony."
14	SECTION 3. Section 710-1027, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	"§710-1027 Resisting an order to stop a motor vehicle[-]
17	in the second degree. (1) A person commits the offense of
18	resisting an order to stop a motor vehicle in the second degree
19	if the person intentionally fails to obey a direction of a law
20	enforcement officer, acting under color of the law enforcement
21	officer's official authority, to stop the person's vehicle.

- 1 (2) Resisting an order to stop a motor vehicle in the
- 2 second degree is a misdemeanor."
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 5 begun before its effective date.
- 6 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
