A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO IDENTIFICATION CARDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 286-306, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "(a) Every identification card issued under this part, 4 whether an original or a renewal, shall bear an expiration date 5 that shall be the date and month of the individual's birthday 6 eight years after the year of issuance; provided that if the 7 individual is a legal nonimmigrant, the certificate shall bear 8 an expiration date that is the same as the expiration date on 9 the individual's arrival-departure record, CBP Form I-94. A 10 cardholder may renew the cardholder's identification card within 11 six months before the day on which it expires by filing an 12 application in accordance with section 286-303 and paying the 13 prescribed fee [establish] established by rules of the 14 director."

15 SECTION 2. Section 286-308, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:



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1	"(a) A cardholder who, after receiving an identification
2	card, has a change in one or more of the following:
3	(1) Name, legally changed by marriage, divorce, adoption,
4	legitimization, order of the lieutenant governor, or
5	other legal means;
6	(2) Citizenship status;
7	(3) Address; or
8	(4) Individual in charge of the cardholder (in the case of
9	a minor or incompetent individual),
10	within thirty days after the change, shall report the change,
11	submit supporting documents, and present the cardholder's
12	identification card to the examiner. The examiner of drivers,
13	upon being furnished with satisfactory proof as to the change,
14	and receiving payment of the fee, if applicable, shall cancel
15	the identification card and issue a new identification card
16	bearing the new name, citizenship status, or address of the
17	cardholder, making appropriate notation of the facts upon the
18	records of the examiner."
19	SECTION 3. Section 286-309, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20	amended to read as follows:



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1	"[+]§286-309[+] Rules. For the purpose of carrying out
2	this part, the director, pursuant to chapter 91, shall adopt
3	rules including rules assessing reasonable fees for the services
4	provided under this part. The rules shall authorize the
5	examiner of drivers to waive any fee in cases of extreme
6	hardship and provide criteria for determining whether a waiver
7	is warranted[-]; provided that the rules shall authorize the
8	examiner of drivers to waive entirely any fee for the issuance
9	<u>of:</u>
10	(1) An original or renewal identification card; or
11	(2) A new identification card as a result of an error
12	correction or change pursuant to section 286-306(b),
13	to a qualified individual who is homeless, subject to
14	verification of the homeless status of the individual by
15	official letter from a homeless services provider. The rules
16	may authorize the examiner of drivers to waive fees for the
17	issuance of identification cards to qualified individuals who
18	are homeless under circumstances such as the loss, destruction,
19	theft, or mutilation of an identification card, subject to
20	conditions imposed by the director through rules."



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1 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
