BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 302A-1159, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

2 amended to read as follows:

3 "S302A-1159 Physical examination required. No child shall

4 attendany school for the first time in the State unless the

5 child presents to the appropriate school official a report from

6 a licensed physician or advanced practice registered nurse of

7 the results of a physical examination performed within a year of

8 the date of attendance at school. The report shall also

9 indicate the name, address, and telephone number of the child's

10 medical provider and dental provider. A child may attend school

11 provisionally upon submitting written documentation from a

12 licensed physician, advanced practice registered nurse, or other

authorized representative of the department of health stating

14 that the child is in the process of undergoing a physical

15 examination. Further documentation showing that the required

16 physical examination has been completed and indicating the name,

17 address, and telephone number of the child's medical provider
