A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that noncandidate committees spend money for the purpose of influencing public 2 3 opinion on issues and candidates through electioneering 4 communications. The legislature further finds that the public should have access to information on the ballot issue or 5 candidate that a noncandidate committee is expending money on. 6 7 The purpose of this Act is to clarify reporting requirements for noncandidate committees for electioneering 8 9 communications. 10 SECTION 2. Section 11-335, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 12 "(b) Schedules filed with the reports shall include the 13 following additional information: (1) The amount and date of deposit of each contribution

 15 received and the name, address, occupation, and
 16 employer of each contributor making a contribution
 17 aggregating more than \$100 during an election period,

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1		whic	n was not previously reported; provided that if
2		all	the information is not on file, the contribution
3		shal	l be returned to the contributor within thirty
4		days	of deposit;
5	(2)	The	amount and date of each contribution made and the
6		name	and address of the candidate, candidate
7		comm	ittee, or noncandidate committee to which the
8	~	cont	ribution was made;
9	(3)	All	expenditures, including the name and address of
10		each	payee and the amount, date, [and] purpose of each
11		expe	nditure $[+]$, and identification of the ballot issue
12		bein	g advocated for or against; provided that:
13		(A)	Expenditures for advertisements or electioneering
14			communications shall include the names of the
15			candidates supported, opposed, or clearly
16			identified[+], and identification of the ballot
17			issue being advocated for or against;
18		(B)	Expenditures for consultants, advertising
19			agencies and similar firms, credit card payments,
20			salaries, and candidate reimbursements shall be
21			itemized to permit a reasonable person to

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1		determine the ultimate intended recipient of the
2		expenditure and its purpose[+], including the
3		identification of the ballot issue being
4		advocated for or against;
5	(C)	Independent expenditures shall include the name
6		of any candidate supported, opposed, or clearly
7		identified[+], and the identification of the
8		ballot issue being advocated for or against; and
9	[+](D)[+]	The purpose of an independent expenditure shall
10		include the name of the candidate who is
11	•	supported or opposed by the expenditure, and
12		whether the expenditure supports or opposes the
13		candidate[+]. It shall also include the
14		identification of the ballot issue being
15		advocated for or against, and whether the
16		expenditure supports or opposes the ballot issue;
17	(4) For 1	noncandidate committees making only independent
18	expe	nditures, certification that no expenditures have
19	been	coordinated with a candidate, candidate
20	commi	ittee, or any agent of a candidate or candidate
21	COMMI	ittee;

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1	(5)	The amount, date of deposit, and description of other
2		receipts and the name and address of the source of
3		each of the other receipts;
4	(6)	A description of each durable asset, the date of
5		acquisition, value at the time of acquisition, and the
6		name and address of the vendor or contributor of the
7		asset; and
8	(7)	The date of disposition of a durable asset, value at
9		the time of disposition, method of disposition, and
10		name and address of the person receiving the asset."
11	SECT	ION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
