A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that noncandidate
2	committees spend money for the purpose of influencing public
3	opinion on ballot issues and questions. The legislature further
4	finds that the public should have clear and easily accessible
5	information concerning any ballot issue or question that a
6	noncandidate committee is expending money on. Under the current
7	law, a noncandidate committee that is a ballot issue committee
8	is required to disclose the specific ballot issue or question
9	only in its organizational report and not in the various
10	expenditure reports that are publicly filed. A noncandidate
11	committee that is not formed to exclusively advocate on a ballot
12	issue or question may nonetheless advocate for or against a
13	ballot issue or question, but is not required to indicate its
14	advocacy position in its organizational report or any other
15	report. In order to make clear to the public when a
16	noncandidate committee is expending money related to a ballot
17	issue or question, the legislature finds that any noncandidate

- 1 committee shall identify and disclose its advocacy for or
- 2 against a ballot issue or question in its expenditure reports.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to increase campaign spending
- 4 transparency by broadening the reporting requirements of
- 5 noncandidate committees when they engage in ballot issue
- 6 advocacy.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 11-302, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by amending the definition of "independent expenditure"
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 ""Independent expenditure" means an expenditure by a person
- 11 expressly advocating [the]:
- 12 (1) The election or defeat of a clearly identified
- 13 candidate that is not made in concert or cooperation
- 14 with or at the request or suggestion of the candidate,
- the candidate committee, a party, or their agents [-];

- 17 (2) For or against any question or issue appearing on the
- 18 ballot in the next applicable election."
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 11-335, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

16		each payee and the amount, date, and purpose of each
17		expenditure; provided that:
18		(A) Expenditures for advertisements or electioneering
19		communications shall include the names of the
20		candidates supported, opposed, or clearly
21		identified;

1	(B) Expe	nditures for consultants, advertising
2	agen	cies and similar firms, credit card payments
3	sala	ries, and candidate reimbursements shall be
4	item	ized to permit a reasonable person to
5	dete	rmine the ultimate intended recipient of the

7	(C) Indep	pendent expenditures shall include the name
8	of a	ny candidate supported, opposed, or clearly
9	iden	tified; and
10	[+] (D) [+] The]	ourpose of an independent expenditure shall
11	incl	ıde [the]:
12	<u>(i)</u>	The name of the candidate who is supported
13		or opposed by the expenditure, and whether
14		the expenditure supports or opposes the
15		candidate; and
16	<u>(ii)</u>	Identification of the ballot issue or
17		question, if any, that is supported or
18		opposed by the expenditure, and whether the
19		expenditure supports or opposes the ballot
20		issue or question.

2		expenditures, certification that no expenditures have
3		been coordinated with a candidate, candidate
4		committee, or any agent of a candidate or candidate
5		committee;

8		each of the other receipts;
9	(6)	A description of each durable asset, the date of
10		acquisition, value at the time of acquisition, and the
11		name and address of the vendor or contributor of the
12		asset; and
13	(7)	The date of disposition of a durable asset, value at
14		the time of disposition, method of disposition, and
15		name and address of the person receiving the asset."
16	SECTION 4. Section 11-338, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

2	calendar	day prior to the election. The late expenditure report	
· 3	shall inc	lude the following information for each expenditure:	
4	(1)	The amount and date made;	
5	(2)	The vendor name, address, and contact information;

7	(3)	The purpose, including the name of any candidate	
8		supported, opposed, or clearly identified by the	
9		expenditure[+]; and	
10	(4)	Identification of the ballot issue or question, if	
11		any, that is supported or opposed by the expenditure,	
12		and whether the expenditure supports or opposes the	
13		ballot issue or question."
