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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ABSENTEE BALLOTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 15-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted 2 and to read as follows: 3 ""Electronic transmission" means the transmission of a 4 blank or voted ballot by facsimile, electronic mail delivery, or 5 the utilization of an online absentee ballot delivery and return 6 system that may include the ability to mark the ballot." 7 8 SECTION 2. Section 15-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows: 10 When a registered voter requests an absentee ballot, "(e) the voter also may include an additional request to receive 11 12 absentee ballots permanently. After receiving a request for permanent absentee voter status, the clerk shall mail to the 13 14 voter who requested permanent absentee voter status an absentee 15 ballot for all subsequent elections conducted in that precinct. 16 The forwarding address for absentee ballots to be permanently 17 mailed shall be the in-state mailing address contained in the 18 voter's registration record. 2	under subsection (a).] Subject to the conditions of subsection		
3	(a), a permanent absentee voter may also request from the clerk		
4	that the voter's ballot be forwarded temporarily to an address		
5	other than the permanent absentee mailing address originally		
6	requested, either in or outside of the State, for a single		
7	election or for a primary or special primary election and the		
8	election immediately following the primary or special primary		
ʻ 9	election. A permanent absentee voter's request for a ballot to		
10	be forwarded temporarily shall not serve as a cancellation of		
11	the voter's permanent absentee status or as a change to the		
12	voter's permanent absentee mailing address. Upon the completion		
13	of the election or elections covered by the permanent absentee		
14	voter's temporary request under this subsection, the clerk shall		
15	resume mailing the voter's ballots to the permanent absentee		
16	mailing address originally requested under subsection (a)."		
17	SECTION 3. Section 15-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
18	amended by amending subsection (h) to read as follows:		
19	"(h) [A] Except as provided in subsection (c), a voter's		
20	permanent absentee voter status shall be terminated if any of		
21	the following conditions apply:		

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1	(1)	The voter requests in writing that such status be	
2		terminated;	
3	(2)	The voter dies, loses voting rights, registers to vote	
4		in another jurisdiction, or is otherwise disqualified	
5		from voting;	
6	(3)	The voter's absentee ballot, voter notification	
7		postcard, or any other election mail is returned to	
8		the clerk as undeliverable for any reason; or	
9	(4)	The voter does not return a voter ballot by 6:00 p.m.	
10		on election day in both the primary and general	
11		election of an election year."	
12	SECT	ION 4. Section 15-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
13	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:	
14	"(b)	If [mailed] a permanent absentee [ballots] ballot	
15	requested	under section 15-4 is not received by $[the]$ a voter	
16	within fi [.]	ve days of an election, or if a voter requires a	
17	replacement ballot within five days of an election, or if a		
18	voter would otherwise not be able to return a properly issued		
19	ballot by the close of polls, then a [covered] voter [under		
20	chapter 1	5Ð] may request that absentee ballots be forwarded by	
21	[facsimil	e.] <u>electronic transmission.</u> Upon receipt of such a	

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request and confirmation that proper application was made, the 1 clerk may transmit appropriate ballots [by facsimile], together 2 3 with a form requiring the affirmations and information required by section 15-6, and a form containing a waiver of the right to 4 5 secrecy, as provided by section 11-137. The voter may return 6 the voted ballots and executed forms by [facsimile] electronic 7 transmission or mail; provided that they are received by the 8 issuing clerk no later than the close of polls on election day. Upon receipt, the clerk shall verify compliance with the 9 10 requirements of section $15-9(c)[_{7}]$ and prepare the ballots for counting pursuant to section 15-10[-]; provided that if the 11 voter returns multiple voted absentee ballots for the same 12 election, the clerk shall, for purposes of counting ballots, 13 14 prepare only the first absentee ballot returned that is not 15 spoiled." SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 17

18 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.19

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Report Title: Office of Elections Package; Absentee Ballots; Electronic Transmission

Description:

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Allows a permanent absentee voter to temporarily receive a ballot at an alternate address for elections within an election cycle. Clarifies that certain conditions that normally lead to a termination of permanent absentee voter status do not apply if the voter resides in an absentee ballot only area. Replaces references to facsimile ballots with references to electronically transmitted ballots. Allows a voter to receive an absentee ballot by electronic transmission if the voter requires such a ballot within five days of an election, or the voter would otherwise not be able to return a properly issued ballot by the close of polls.
