A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the near shore
- 2 marine resources of the State have declined over several
- 3 generations, impacting Native Hawaiian traditional and customary
- 4 practices, all residents' lifestyle, and the visitor industry.
- 5 Land-based sources of pollution, invasive species, overuse, and
- 6 poor management have all played a part in our near shore ocean's
- 7 decline. At the same time, present and future users should be
- 8 able to partake in the ocean as past generations once did. This
- 9 situation necessitates the implementation of innovative and
- 10 effective approaches, policies, and regulations that are
- 11 informed by the values of the people of Hawaii.
- 12 The legislature further finds that Hawaii's people have a
- 13 long tradition of resource stewardship and strong stewardship
- 14 values that are essential to reversing resource declines.
- 15 Community-based co-management of near shore marine areas, that
- 16 is, communities working with government, is recognized as an
- 17 effective tool to increase opportunities for stakeholder
- involvement, re-invigorate Hawaii's history and culture of 2016-0862 SB2139 SD1 SMA.doc



- 1 mālama 'āina, increase voluntary compliance with regulations, and
- 2 ultimately improve resource conditions and availability for
- 3 future generations. In more than two dozen coastal areas across
- 4 the State, local communities want to engage in marine co-
- 5 management to sustain resources and preserve traditional
- 6 practices. All of these processes include families, fishermen,
- 7 kūpuna, youth, government, and many others with deep and caring
- 8 ties to their coastal areas.
- 9 The legislature further finds that efforts need to be
- 10 devised to bring users and other interests together rather than
- 11 further divide them. These efforts promote tradition and
- 12 culture not as artifacts to be preserved in books and museums,
- 13 but as solutions to be practiced as keys to a sustainable
- 14 future.
- 15 Research and experience in Hawaii and around the world
- 16 demonstrate that community-based co-management of marine
- 17 resources in partnership with government can be a successful
- 18 policy and management strategy because:
- 19 (1) It recognizes and honors the unique resources,
- habitat, condition, people, and tradition of each
- 21 place;

1	(2)	Community members have a high level of identification
2		with and commitment to their place;
3	(3)	Community members are respected as local leaders and
4		directly involved in decisions and management with
5		shared norms, trust, communication, and connection
6		between networks and groups of stakeholders;
7	(4)	Co-management fosters a sense of kuleana through
8		genuine sharing of responsibility and authority with
9		government in policy development, decision-making, and
10		setting standards of conduct; and
11	(5)	An engaged community has a shared commitment to
12		compliance in preservation, achievement of successful
13		resource enhancement, and promotion of sustainable
14		use.
15	The o	department of land and natural resources has the
16	statutory	mandate to implement policies and management
17	strategies	s, which include community-based co-management, to
18	preserve a	and protect Hawaii's marine resources and traditional
19	practices	. In order to successfully implement appropriate
20	programs a	and to grow and maintain the active participation and

trust of communities, the department needs consistent technical

- 1 and staff capacity to engage with communities and other
- 2 stakeholders and to deliver government services effectively.
- 3 The legislature further finds that the increase in ocean
- 4 use and threats necessitates the development of innovative
- 5 partnerships, policies, regulations, and strategies in the
- 6 department of land and natural resources to ensure the
- 7 department meets its mandate to properly manage and administer
- 8 the aquatic resources of the State. In the area of community-
- 9 based co-management of marine resources, this includes having
- 10 the essential staff members who can engage with interested
- 11 communities and help them to coordinate traditional stewardship
- 12 practices with the departmental systems and processes, to
- 13 develop community-driven rules and standards of conduct that
- 14 meet the State's regulatory requirements, and to implement a
- 15 collaborative and effective approach to compliance with
- 16 community-based standards and rules.
- 17 The purpose of this Act is to make key positions permanent
- 18 within the department of land and natural resources.
- 19 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 21 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for

- 1 program operating costs and to establish three permanent full-
- 2 time equivalent (3.00 FTE) positions in the division of aquatic
- 3 resources of the department of land and natural resources to
- 4 include a community-based fishing area planner, a marine
- 5 regulation and policy specialist, and an aquatic invasive
- 6 species program specialist to support community-based co-
- 7 management of near shore marine resources and implement
- 8 effective rule-making.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 10 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 13 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for
- 14 program operating costs and to establish two permanent full-time
- 15 equivalent (2.00 FTE) positions in the division of conservation
- 16 and resources enforcement of the department of land and natural
- 17 resources to include a makai watch coordinator and a marine
- 18 regulation and policy specialist to work with communities and
- 19 state enforcement officers to help ensure compliance with
- 20 resource use and protection standards and regulations.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 2 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for
- 6 conversion of twelve temporary positions in the division of
- 7 conservation and resources enforcement of the department of land
- 8 and natural resources to permanent positions and for personal
- 9 services, training, equipment, motor vehicles, vessels, and
- 10 other current expenses for community fisheries enforcement units
- 11 to support enforcement and community engagement, outreach, and
- 12 awareness of marine regulations.
- 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 14 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
