12	(5)	A person who has served as a juror, either in a court
13		of this State or the United States District Court for
14		the District of Hawaii, within one year preceding the
15		time of filling out the juror qualification form;

1	(7) A person living more than seventy miles from the court
2	for which jury service is required; or
3	(8) A person [eighty] seventy years of age or older.
4	For purposes of this section, "emergency medical services
5	agency" means any government agency, private agency, or company

7	disaster medical services."
8	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
9	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
10	begun before its effective date.

13	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2016.
