A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO REESTABLISH A VECTOR CONTROL BRANCH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Vector control involves controlling the spread
- 2 of animals that have the potential to carry disease, from
- 3 rodents to insects, including mosquitoes. However, the Hawaii
- 4 department of health currently has no vector control branch and
- 5 its vector control unit suffered severe funding cuts several
- 6 years ago.
- According to a June 17, 2015, news story on KHON2,
- 8 department of health officials plan to hire more workers for its
- 9 vector control unit, but the department still will not have
- 10 nearly as many workers as it once did. A wave of cost-cutting
- 11 in 2009 eliminated dozens of workers tasked with controlling
- 12 mosquitoes and rats.
- 13 The legislature finds that the current outbreak of dengue
- 14 fever necessitates an appropriation to the department of health
- 15 to hire more vector control employees and reestablish a vector
- 16 control branch.



- 1 The purpose of this Act is to make an appropriation for the
- 2 department of health to hire more full-time employees for vector
- 3 control and reestablish a vector control branch.
- 4 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 to
- 7 the department of health to hire full-time equivalent (.0
- 8 FTE) positions for vector control, including a vector control
- 9 program manager and three staff positions, and to take steps to
- 10 fully reestablish a vector control sector branch within the
- 11 department's environmental health administration.
- 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 13 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
