A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SICK LEAVE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 388, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and 3 to read as follows: 4 "PART SICK LEAVE 5 §388-A Establishment of a sick leave payroll tax. (a) 6 There shall be a tax imposed upon the salary of each employee of 7 an employer who employed at least ten employees in the previous 8 year. 9 From fiscal year 2016-2017 to fiscal year 2021-2022, 10 the tax shall be assessed against each employee as follows: 11 (1) 0.025 per cent of the salary of each employee who 12 earned more than \$50,000 but less than \$100,000 during 13 the year; and 14 (2) 0.05 per cent of the salary of each employee who 15 earned \$100,000 or more during the year. 16 (c) From fiscal year 2022-2023 and thereafter, the taxes

shall be set by the payroll board.

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(d) The assessment shall be collected each payroll period 1 by the employer and remitted on behalf of the employer's 2 employees to the department for deposit into the payroll trust 3 4 fund on a monthly basis. §388-B Establishment of payroll trust fund. (a) There is 5 established in the treasury of the State, separate from all 6 7 public moneys or funds of the State, a payroll trust fund, which shall be administered by the payroll board for the purposes of 8 this part. All assessments pursuant to this part shall be paid 9 into the fund and all benefits payable under this part shall be 10 11 paid from the fund. The fund shall consist of: All assessments collected pursuant to this part, 12 (1)together with any interest thereon; 13 All fines and penalties for the fund pursuant to this 14 (2) 15 part; All moneys collected by way of subrogation; (3) 16 Interest earned on any moneys in the fund; 17 (4)Any property or securities acquired through the use of 18 (5) 19 moneys belonging to the fund;

- 13 SECTION 2. Section 392-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 "§392-28 Duplication of benefits not permitted. No
- 16 temporary disability benefits shall be payable for any period of
- 17 disability for which the employee is entitled to receive:
- 18 (1) Weekly benefits under the Employment Security Law or
- 19 similar laws of this State or of any other state or of
- the United States, or under any temporary disability

- 5 (3) Weekly benefits for total disability under the 6 Workers' Compensation Law of this State or any other state or of the United States, except benefits for 7 8 permanent partial or permanent total disability 9 previously incurred. If the claimant does not receive **10** benefits under such workers' compensation law and the 11 claimant's entitlement to such benefits is seriously 12 disputed, the employee, if otherwise eligible, shall 13 receive temporary disability benefits under this chapter, but any insurer or employer or the trust fund 14 15 for disability benefits providing such benefits shall be subrogated, as hereinafter provided, to the 16 17 employee's right to benefits under the workers' 18 compensation law for the period of disability for 19 which the employee received benefits under this 20 chapter to the extent of the benefits so received.

1	(4)	Indemnity payments for wage loss under any applicable
2		employers' liability law of this State, or of any
3		other state or of the United States. If an employee
4		has received benefits under this chapter for a period
5		of disability for which the employee is entitled to
6		such indemnity payments, any insurer or employer or
7		the trust fund for disability benefits providing such
8		benefits shall be subrogated to the employee's right
9		to such indemnity payments in the amount of the
10		benefits paid under this chapter as hereinafter
11		provided.

- 12 (5) Benefits for sick leave under part of chapter 388."
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 14 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 15 begun before its effective date.
- 16 SECTION 4. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 17 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 18 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 19 the new sections in this Act.
- 20 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
