A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICINE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is facing a
- 2 significant physician shortage as demand for services grows
- 3 among the State's aging population and more doctors leave the
- 4 workforce. The current shortage is estimated at more than seven
- 5 hundred physicians, a statistic that is expected to double by
- 6 2020. The neighbor islands in particular face an especially
- 7 critical shortage of physicians.
- 8 The legislature further finds that foreign medical
- 9 graduates serve an integral role in the delivery of health care
- 10 throughout the country, including filling much-needed physician
- 11 positions in health professional shortage areas. Foreign
- 12 medical graduates must complete strict training and licensing
- 13 requirements prior to licensure in Hawaii.
- 14 However, the legislature additionally finds that existing
- 15 statute has been interpreted to require foreign medical
- 16 graduates to pass the Federation Licensing Examination (FLEX),
- 17 the United States Medical Licensing Examination, or a



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2 Medical Graduates (ECFMG) qualifying examination prior to 1984. 3 This requirement has caused some confusion, as the FLEX exam did not exist prior to 1984 and it therefore would not have been 4 5 possible for a foreign medical graduate to take both the FLEX 6 and the ECFMG examinations prior to 1984. The legislature notes 7 that clarifying existing law will not compromise the State's 8 medical qualifications, but will eliminate potential confusion associated with requirements for licensure of foreign medical 9 10 graduates. 11 Accordingly, the purpose of this measure is to clarify that 12 a foreign medical graduate must have passed either: 13 (1)The Educational Commission for Foreign Medical 14 Graduates qualifying examination on or after 1984; or 15 (2) The Federation Licensing Examination, United States 16 Medical Licensing Examination, a combination of these
