### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LICENSING INSPECTIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of 2 health is responsible for licensing, certifying, and monitoring 3 several types of facilities, including care facilities and 4 medical marijuana dispensary facilities, to ensure a standard of 5 quality. To ensure that these facilities are providing a high 6 standard of quality on a day-to-day basis, inspections and 7 visits of these facilities should be unannounced to prevent a 8 prepared appearance that does not truly portray the regular 9 quality of operations that the facility provides on an ongoing 10 basis.

11 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of 12 health to conduct visits and relicensing or recertification 13 inspections without notice for state-licensed care facilities 14 and unannounced inspections for license renewals for medical 15 marijuana dispensaries.

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1	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated

10	departmen	t to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of each
11	resident:	
12	(1)	Adult day health centers;
13	(2)	Adult day care centers;
14	<u>(3)</u>	Community care foster family homes;
15	(4)	Developmental disabilities domiciliary homes;
16	(5)	Adult foster homes;
17	(6)	Long-term care facilities, including but not limited

19		(A) Adult residential care homes;
20		(B) Expanded adult residential care homes;
21		(C) Assisted living facilities;

5	(b) Unannounced visits may be conducted during or outside

9	be conducted unannounced during or outside regular business
10	hours. Annual inspections for relicensing or recertification
11	may be conducted during regular business hours or at intervals
12	determined by the department. Annual inspections for
13	relicensing or recertification shall be conducted without
14	notice.
15	(c) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
16	91 to effectuate the purposes of this section."
17	SECTION 3. Section 321-15.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
19	"(a) All adult residential care homes shall be licensed to
20	ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the individuals placed
21	therein. The department shall conduct [ <del>unannounced visits,</del>

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1	other than the inspection for relicensing, to every licensed
2	adult residential care home and expanded adult residential care
3	home on an annual basis and at such intervals as determined by
4	the department to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of each
5	resident. Unannounced visits may be conducted during or outside
6	regular business hours. All inspections relating to follow up
7	visits, visits to confirm correction of deficiencies, or visits
8	to investigate complaints or suspicion of abuse or neglect shall
9	be conducted unannounced during or outside regular business
10	hours. Annual inspections for relicensing may be conducted
11	during regular business hours or at intervals determined by the
12	department. Annual inspections for relicensing shall be
13	conducted with notice, unless otherwise determined by the
14	department.] visits and inspections pursuant to section 321"
15	SECTION 4. Section 321-15.62, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
17	"(a) All expanded adult residential care homes shall be
18	licensed to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the
19	individuals placed therein. The department shall conduct visits
20	and inspections pursuant to section 321"

13		manufactured marijuana products for content,
14		contamination, and consistency;
15	(12)	The quantities of marijuana and manufactured marijuana
16		products that a dispensary may sell or provide to a
17		qualifying patient or primary caregiver; provided that
18		no dispensary shall sell or provide to a qualifying
19		patient or primary caregiver any combination of
20		marijuana and manufactured products that:

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1		(A) During a period of fifteen consecutive days,
2		exceeds the equivalent of four ounces of
3		marijuana; or
4		(B) During a period of thirty consecutive days,
5		exceeds the equivalent of eight ounces of

8		prevent the unauthorized diversion of marijuana or
9		manufactured marijuana products or the distribution of

13		chapter; provided that the controls, at a minimum,
14		shall include:
15		(A) A computer software tracking system as specified
16		in section 329D-6(j) and (k); and
17		(B) Product packaging standards sufficient to allow
18		law enforcement personnel to reasonably determine
19		the contents of an unopened package;
20	(14)	Limitation to the size or format of signs placed
21		outside a retail dispensing location or production

2		mini	mum, shall comply with section 329D-6(o)(2) and
3		shal	l not include the image of a cartoon character or

5	(15)	The	disposal or destruction of unwanted or unused

7	(16)	The	enforcement of the following prohibitions against:
8		(A)	The sale or provision of marijuana or
9			manufactured marijuana products to unauthorized
10			persons;
11		(B)	The sale or provision of marijuana or
12			manufactured marijuana products to qualifying
13			patients or primary caregivers in quantities that
14			exceed limits established by this chapter;
15		(C)	Any use or consumption of marijuana or
16			manufactured marijuana products on the premises
17			of a retail dispensing location or production
18			center; and
19		(D)	The distribution of marijuana or manufactured
20			marijuana products, for free, on the premises of

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1		a retail dispensing location or production
2		center;
3	(17)	The establishment of a range of penalties for
4		violations of this chapter or rule adopted thereto;
5		and
6	(18)	A process to recognize and register patients who are
7		authorized to purchase, possess, and use medical
8		marijuana in another state, United States territory,
9		or the District of Columbia as qualifying patients in
10		this State; provided that this registration process
11		may commence no sooner than January 1, 2018."
12	SECT	ION 7. Section 329D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
14	"(a)	Each medical marijuana production center and
15	dispensar	y licensed pursuant to this part shall:
16	(1)	Be subject to an annual announced inspection and
17		unlimited unannounced inspections of its operations by
18		the department; provided that inspections for license
19		renewals shall be unannounced.



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1	(2)	Submit reports on at least a quarterly basis, or as
2		otherwise required, and in the format specified by the
3	χ.	department; and
4	(3)	Annually cause an independent financial audit, at the
5		dispensary licensee's own expense, to be conducted of
6		the dispensary, its production center, and retail
7		dispensing locations and shall submit the audit's
8		findings to the department."
