A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that school physical
- 2 examinations are currently only conducted upon entry into the
- 3 public school system, usually in kindergarten. The expansion of
- 4 physical examination requirements for public school students
- 5 will help reinforce a culture of wellness and preventative
- 6 health care in the State. Furthermore, for children and
- 7 adolescents who are obese, an additional physical examination
- 8 visit provides an opportunity for the health care provider to
- 9 assess the possible causes of obesity and develop a plan to
- 10 support family-based lifestyle changes.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to require a child to provide
- 12 written documentation of a physical examination performed within
- 13 twelve months prior to attending seventh grade at a public
- 14 school.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 302A-1159, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:



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1	"\$302A-1159 Physical examination required. (a) Beginning
2	with the 2017-2018 school year, no child shall attend seventh
3	grade unless the child presents to the appropriate school
4	official written documentation from a licensed physician or
5	advanced practice registered nurse showing completion of the
6.	required physical examination performed within twelve months
7	before the date of attendance. A child may attend school
8	provisionally upon submitting written documentation from a
9	licensed physician, advanced practice registered nurse, or
10	authorized representative of the department of health stating
11	that the child is in the process of undergoing a physical
12	examination; provided that further documentation showing that
13	the required physical examination has been completed shall be
14	submitted to the appropriate school official no later than three
15	months after the child first attends seventh grade.
16	(b) No child shall attend any school for the first time in
17	the State unless the child presents to the appropriate school
18	official a report from a licensed physician or advanced practice
19	registered nurse of the results of a physical examination
20	performed within [a year of] twelve months before the date of
21	attendance at school. A child may attend school provisionally

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- upon submitting written documentation from a licensed physician, 1
- advanced practice registered nurse, or other authorized 2
- representative of the department of health stating that the 3
- child is in the process of undergoing a physical examination. 4
- Further documentation showing that the required physical 5
- examination has been completed shall be submitted to the 6
- 7 appropriate school official no later than three months after the
- child first attends the school." 8
- SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 9
- and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 10
- This Act shall take effect upon its approval. SECTION 4. 11

Description:

Beginning with the 2017-2018 school year, requires a child to provide written documentation of a physical examination performed within twelve months prior to attending seventh grade at a public school. Provides for provisional attendance if an exam is scheduled.
