A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ETHICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| 1 | SECTION 1. Chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended |

| 9 | subsection (a), the conduct of the employee shall comply with |

| 11 | (1) The employee shall not solicit, accept, or receive, |
| 12 | directly or indirectly any gift for engaging in |
| 13 | extracurricular service, as provided in section 84-11; |
| 14 | provided that the employee may receive detached |
| 15 | remuneration for the performance of extracurricular |

- 14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059.
