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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

2	SECTION 1. Chapter 194, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
3	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated			
4	and to read as follows:			
5	" <u>§194-</u> Invasive species list amendment. Without regard			
6	to the notice and public hearing requirements of chapter 91, the			
7	council may adopt rules to make additions to or deletions from			
8	the list identifying invasive species present in the State			
9	required by section 194-2(a)(6); provided that the council shall			
10	adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to establish methods to			
11	obtain public input and notify the public of additions to or			
12	deletions from the list identifying invasive species present in			
13	the State required by section 194-2(a)(6); provided further than			
14	the list shall not include any domesticated pet species."			
15	SECTION 2. Section 194-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
16	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:			
17	"(a) Whenever any invasive species identified by the			
18	council for control or eradication is found on private property,			
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a department or its agent may enter [such] the affected premises 1 to control or eradicate the invasive species after reasonable 2 notice is given to the owner of the property and, if entry is 3 refused, pursuant to the court order in subsection (d)." 4 5 PART II 6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 to 8 9 the department of land and natural resources division of 10 forestry and wildlife for the immediate, coordinated management 11 of albizia trees that threaten access to critical emergency services and transportation routes identified by the Hawaii 12 county civil defense agency for the island of Hawaii, as 13 14 follows: 15 The funds shall be expended solely for the coordinated (1)16 management of albizia trees on the island of Hawaii, 17 except that other plants may be incidentally removed in the process. If the project cannot be continued, 18 19 funds may be transferred to another island invasive 20 species committee to accomplish the same purpose on 21 that island;

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1	(2)	Albi	zia trees shall be completely removed from highway	
2		rights of way, and albizia trees outside the right of		
3		way that are deemed non-hazardous shall be treated and		
4		left in place; and		
5	(3)	Control of albizia trees shall be concentrated in the		
6		following areas:		
7		(A)	The two-mile stretch of highway 132 between Lava	
8			Tree state park and Pahoa;	
9		(B)	Isolated patches of albizia trees between	
10	:		Kalapana and Pahoa;	
11		(C)	Isolated patches of albizia trees between Pahoa	
12			and Keaau;	
13		(D)	The hospital corridor, particularly the segment	
14			of Waianuenue avenue from Komohana street to	
15			Akolea road, the segment of Akolea road from	
16			Waianuenue avenue to Kaumana drive, and Puainako	
17			street from highway 11 to Kaumana drive; and	
18		(E)	Any additional areas of the island of Hawaii as	
19			deemed necessary by the Big Island invasive	
20			species committee.	

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The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
 land and natural resources division of forestry and wildlife for
 use by the Big Island invasive species committee for the
 purposes of this Act.

5 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

7 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
8 provided that section 3 of this Act shall take effect on July 1,
9 2016.

Report Title: Hawaii Invasive Species Council; Invasive Species; Entering Private Property; Albizia; Appropriation

Description:

Authorizes HISC to adopt rules to change its invasive species list. Prohibits the inclusion of domesticated pet species on the invasive species list. Authorizes an agent of HISC to enter affected premises on private property, under specific conditions, to control or eradicate invasive species. Makes an appropriation to the department of land and natural resources division of forestry and wildlife for use by the Big Island invasive species committee for the immediate coordinated management of albizia trees on the island of Hawaii.
