Penalties; Timber Trespass in Forest Reserves; Destruction or Harvesting of Trees and Plants on State Lands; Koa Trees; Forest Reserve Violations

Description:

Amends fines for the destroying or harvesting koa trees and other trees and plants on state lands to an amount up to the current market value of each tree or plant. Clarifies that any person that violates: (1) section 183-17, HRS timber trespass in forest reserves, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor; or (2) a provision of part II of chapter 183, HRS, (forest reserves) or any rule adopted pursuant thereto, other than section 183-17, HRS, shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor. Repeals the general penalty provision of chapter 183, HRS. (SD1)
