A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AQUATIC RESOURCES PENALTIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 187A-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§187A-13 General penalty[+]; community service. (a) Any
- 4 person violating this chapter or any rule adopted thereunder for
- 5 which a penalty is not otherwise provided, shall be guilty of a
- 6 petty misdemeanor and, in addition to any other penalties, shall
- 7 be fined not less than:
- 8 (1) \$250 for a first offense;
- 9 (2) \$500 for a second offense; and
- (3) \$1,000 for a third or subsequent offense.
- 11 (b) [The fines specified in this section shall not be
- 12 suspended or waived.] The court may require the defendant to
- 13 complete an aquatic resources educational class administered by
- 14 the department in addition to or in lieu of paying all or any
- 15 part of any monetary fine authorized by this section.
- (c) The court may direct the defendant to perform
- 17 community service as administered by the department in lieu of
- 18 paying any monetary fine authorized by this section."



- 1 SECTION 2. Section 188-70, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§188-70 Penalties. (a) Any person violating any
- 4 provision of or any rule adopted pursuant to this chapter,
- 5 except sections 188-23 and 188-39.5, is guilty of a petty
- 6 misdemeanor and, in addition to any other penalties, shall be
- 7 fined not less than:
- 8 (1) \$100 for a first offense;
- 9 (2) \$200 for a second offense; and
- 10 (3) \$500 for a third or subsequent offense.
- 11 (b) Any person violating section 188-23, is guilty of a
- 12 class C felony and shall be sentenced pursuant to chapter 706;
- 13 provided that the environmental court, in addition to any term
- 14 of imprisonment or any other terms and conditions of probation,
- 15 shall order the defendant to pay a fine of not less than \$1,000.
- 16 Notwithstanding section 706-669 and any other law to the
- 17 contrary, any person in violation of subsection (b), as a first
- 18 offense, shall be sentenced to a mandatory minimum period of
- 19 imprisonment without possibility of parole for thirty days.
- 20 Repeat offenders shall be sentenced pursuant to chapter 706.

- 1 (c) [The fines specified in this section shall not be
- 2 suspended or waived. The court may require the defendant to
- 3 complete an aquatic resources educational class administered by
- 4 the department of land and natural resources in addition to or
- 5 in lieu of paying all or any part of any monetary fine
- 6 authorized by this section.
- 7 (d) The court may direct the defendant to perform
- 8 community service as administered by the department of land and
- 9 natural resources in lieu of paying any monetary fine authorized
- 10 by this section."
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 190-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 "\$190-5 Penalty. (a) Any person violating this chapter,
- 14 any rule adopted pursuant thereto, or the terms and conditions
- 15 of any permit issued under section 190-4, shall be guilty of a
- 16 petty misdemeanor and punished as provided in subsections (b)
- 17 and (c).
- 18 (b) The punishment, in addition to any other penalties,
- 19 shall be a fine of not less than:
- 20 (1) \$250 for a first offense:
- 21 (2) \$500 for a second offense; and

- 1 (3) \$1,000 for a third or subsequent offense.
- 2 (c) [The fines specified in this section shall not be
- 3 suspended or waived.] The court may require the defendant to
- 4 complete an aquatic resources educational class administered by
- 5 the department of land and natural resources in addition to or
- 6 in lieu of paying all or any part of any monetary fine
- 7 authorized by this section.
- 8 (d) The court may allow the defendant to perform community
- 9 service as administered by the department of land and natural
- 10 resources in lieu of paying any monetary fine authorized by this
- 11 section."
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 13 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 14 begun before its effective date.
- 15 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Description:

Authorizes the court to require a person who violates certain laws pertaining to aquatic resources to: (1) complete an aquatic resources educational class administered by the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) in addition to or in lieu of paying a monetary fine; and (2) perform community service administered by DLNR in lieu of paying a monetary fine.
