A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION PRACTICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to require public
2 disclosure of the information contained in the official daily
3 calendar of the governor, lieutenant governor, state department
4 directors, and state agency heads.

5 SECTION 2. Section 92F-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

7 "(a) Any other provision in this chapter to the contrary
8 notwithstanding, each agency shall make available for public
9 inspection and duplication during regular business hours:

10 (1) Rules of procedure, substantive rules of general
11 applicability, statements of general policy, and
12 interpretations of general applicability adopted by
13 the agency;

14 (2) Final opinions, including concurring and dissenting
15 opinions, as well as orders made in the adjudication
16 of cases, except to the extent protected by section
17 92F-13(1);



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(3) Government purchasing information, including all bid results, except to the extent prohibited by section 92F-13;

(4) Pardons and commutations, as well as directory information concerning an individual's presence at any correctional facility;

(5) Land ownership, transfer, and lien records, including real property tax information and leases of state land;

(6) Results of environmental tests;

(7) Minutes of all agency meetings required by law to be public;

(8) Name, address, and occupation of any person borrowing funds from a state or county loan program, and the amount, purpose, and current status of the loan;

(9) Certified payroll records on public works contracts except social security numbers and home addresses;

(10) Regarding contract hires and consultants employed by agencies:

(A) The contract itself, the amount of compensation;

(B) The duration of the contract; and

2 except social security numbers and home addresses;
- 3 (11) Building permit information within the control of the
4 agency;
- 5 (12) Water service consumption data maintained by the
6 boards of water supply;
- 7 (13) Rosters of persons holding licenses or permits granted
8 by an agency that may include name, business address,
9 type of license held, and status of the license;
- 10 (14) The name, compensation (but only the salary range for
11 employees covered by or included in chapter 76, and
12 sections 302A-602 to 302A-639, and 302A-701, or
13 bargaining unit (8)), job title, business address,
14 business telephone number, job description, education
15 and training background, previous work experience,
16 dates of first and last employment, position number,
17 type of appointment, service computation date,
18 occupational group or class code, bargaining unit
19 code, employing agency name and code, department,
20 division, branch, office, section, unit, and island of
21 employment, of present or former officers or employees



1 of the agency; provided that this paragraph shall not
2 require the creation of a roster of employees; and
3 provided further that this paragraph shall not apply
4 to information regarding present or former employees
5 involved in an undercover capacity in a law
6 enforcement agency;

7 (15) Information collected and maintained for the purpose
8 of making information available to the general public;
9 [and]

10 (16) Information contained in or compiled from a
11 transcript, minutes, report, or summary of a
12 proceeding open to the public[-]; and

13 (17) Information contained in the official daily calendar
14 of the governor, lieutenant governor, state department
15 head, or state agency head, as applicable."

16 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

18 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
