A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to reestablish the
- 2 governor's authority to nominate and, with the advice and
- 3 consent of the senate, appoint the members of the board of
- 4 regents of the University of Hawaii by repealing the candidate
- 5 advisory council for the board of regents of the University of
- 6 Hawaii; provided that this Act shall be implemented upon
- 7 ratification of the constitutional amendment to article X.
- 8 section 6, of the Hawaii State Constitution, which would delete
- 9 provisions related to the candidate advisory council for the
- 10 board of regents for the University of Hawaii.
- It is the intent of the legislature that the governor
- 12 nominate members immediately upon the effectiveness of this Act.
- 13 The current regents shall each be replaced by a member nominated
- 14 and, with the advice and consent of the senate, appointed by the
- 15 governor pursuant to this Act.
- 16 SECTION 2. Section 304A-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:



1	"§304A-104 Regents; appointment; tenure; qualifications;
2	meetings. (a) The affairs of the university shall be under the
3	general management and control of the board of regents. The
4	board shall consist of fifteen members who shall be appointed by
5	the governor [from lists of qualified candidates presented to
6	the governor by the candidate advisory council, pursuant to
7	section 304A-104.6,] and shall be confirmed by the senate[$ au$
8	provided that if the list of qualified candidates includes fewer
9	than three-candidates at any time during the nomination and
10	confirmation process, the governor may request that the
11	candidate advisory council reopen recruitment for qualified
12	<pre>candidates.]; provided that:</pre>
13	(1) One member representing the city and county of
14	Honolulu shall be appointed from a list of three
15	nominees submitted by the president of the senate;
16	(2) One member representing the city and county of
17	Honolulu shall be appointed from a list of three
18	nominees submitted by the speaker of the house of
19	representatives;

1	(3)	One at-large member shall be appointed from a list of
2		three nominees submitted by the president of the
3		senate; and
4	(4)	One at-large member shall be appointed from a list of
5		three nominees submitted by the speaker of the house
6		of representatives;
7	provided f	urther that the selection process in paragraphs (1) to
8	(4) shall	not include the student member of the board. Members
9	may be rem	oved by the governor. Except as otherwise provided by
10	law, state	officers shall be eligible for appointment and
11	membership	•
12	The t	erm of each member shall be five years, except as
13	provided f	or the initial appointment in section 26-11; provided
14	that the t	erm of the student member shall be two years. Every
15	member may	serve beyond the expiration date of the member's term
16	of appoint	ment until the member's successor has been appointed
17	by the gov	ernor and confirmed by the senate in accordance with
18	article X,	section 6 of the Hawaii State Constitution. Members
19	shall serv	e no more than two consecutive five-year terms;
20	provided t	hat the members who are initially appointed to terms
21	of two yea	rs or less pursuant to section 26-11(a) may be

reappointed to two ensuing five-year terms. If a member is to 1 be appointed to a second term of five years, the senate shall 2 consider the question of whether to reconfirm the member at 3 least one hundred twenty days prior to the conclusion of a 4 5 member's first five-year term; provided that if the senate is 6 not in session within one hundred twenty days prior to the 7 conclusion of the member's first five-year term, the member shall continue to serve until the senate convenes for the next 8 9 regular session or the next special session for which the senate is authorized to consider the question of reconfirmation. 10 In determining whether to confirm the governor's 11 12 nominee to the board of regents, the senate shall consider the 13 combination of abilities, breadth of experiences, and characteristics of the board of regents, as a whole, that will 14 best serve the diverse interests and needs of the students of 15 the university system and assist the university system in 16 17 achieving its strategic goals and performance indicators. 18 senate shall consider whether the board reflects the diversity 19 of the student population, the various counties of the State, and a broad representation of higher education-related 20 21 stakeholders.

1 (c) At its first meeting after June 30 of each year, the board of regents shall elect a chairperson and one or more vice-2 chairpersons who shall serve until the adjournment of the first 3 meeting of the board of regents after June 30 of the next year, 4 5 or thereafter until their successors are elected; provided that the chairperson and vice chairpersons shall not be elected prior 6 7 to the taking of office of regents whose terms shall begin on 8 July 1 of that year. The board shall appoint a secretary, who 9 shall not be a member of the board. The president of the 10 university shall act as executive officer of the board. A majority of the board of regents shall constitute a quorum to 11 conduct business, and the concurrence of a majority of all the 12 13 members to which the board of regents is entitled shall be necessary to make any action of the board of regents valid. 14 board shall meet at least ten times annually and, from time to 15 time, may meet in each of the counties of Hawaii, Maui, and 16 17 Kauai. 18 [-(d)—The governor shall notify—the candidate—advisory council for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii in 19 20 writing within ten days of receiving notification that a member

         (c) (d) The members of the board of regents shall serve
4
    without pay but shall be entitled to their travel expenses
5
    within the State when attending meetings of the board or when
6
    actually engaged in business relating to the work of the board."

         SECTION 3. Section 304A-104.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

    repealed.

         ["[$304A-104.6] Candidate advisory council for the board
10
    of regents of the University of Hawaii. (a) The candidate
11
    advisory council for the board of regents of the University of
12
    Hawaii shall recruit, evaluate, and present to the governor
13
    qualified candidates for nomination to a vacant seat on the
    board of regents. The candidate advisory council shall be
14
15
    attached to the University of Hawaii for administrative
16
    purposes.

         (b)— The candidate—advisory council shall:

         (1) Develop and implement a fair and independent procedure
19
              for evaluating candidates to serve on the board of
20
              regents;

1	(2)	Require candidates and members of their immediate
2		families to disclose any existing or anticipated
3		contracts or financial transactions with the
4		University of Hawaii;
5	(3)	Actively solicit and accept applications from
6		potential candidates;
7	(4)	Evaluate candidates for the board of regents on their
8		background, experience, and potential for discharging
9		the responsibilities of a member of the board of
10		regents, based upon the qualifications imposed by the
11		Hawaii-State Constitution; and
12	(5)	Present a list of at least three candidates to the
13		governor for nomination and appointment for each
14		vacant seat on the board of regents of the University
15		of Hawaii.
16	(c)	The candidate advisory council shall initiate the
17	recruitme	nt and evaluation of candidates for each vacancy on the
18	board-of-	regents within:
19	(1)	Sixty days of a vacancy; or
20	(2)	At least one hundred twenty days prior to the
21		expiration of a regently term.

1	(d) To provide continuity for the board of regents, the		
2	governor may recommend to the candidate advisory council the		
3	reappointment of a member of the board of regents, subject to		
4	the advice and consent of the senate.		
5	(e) The candidate advisory council shall consist of seven		
6	voting members to be appointed without regard to section 26-34		
7	as-follows:		
8	(1) One member who shall be appointed by the president of		
9	the-senate;		
10	(2) One member who shall be appointed by the speaker of		
11	the house of representatives; and		
12	(3) Five members who shall be appointed by the governor.		
13	A member of the Association of Emeritus Regents of the		
14	University of Hawaii, appointed by the chair of the Association		
15	of Emeritus Regents of the University of Hawaii, shall serve as		
16	an ex officio, nonvoting member of the candidate advisory		
17	eouncil, for a term not to exceed two years; provided that the		
18	appointment shall run concurrently with the term of the		
19	appointing chair.		
20	The president of the senate, speaker of the house of		
21	representatives, and governor are encouraged to appoint full-		

1	time students of the university, university faculty, university
2	staff, or university alumni to the candidate advisory council;
3	provided that if a full time student is appointed to the
4	candidate advisory council, the student shall have been enrolled
5	as a full-time student for at least three consecutive semesters
6	and shall serve for a term of two years.
7	(f) Voting members of the candidate advisory council shall
8	serve for the following terms:
9	(1) Those appointed by the president of the senate and
10	speaker of the house of representatives shall serve
11	for a term of four years; and
12	(2) Those appointed by the governor shall serve for a term
13	of four years; provided that such appointments shall
14	run concurrently with the term of the appointing
15	governor.
16	(g) Appointees to the candidate advisory council shall
17	have a general understanding of the purposes of higher
18	education, the mission and strategic goals of the University of
19	Hawaii system, and the role and responsibilities of the board of
20	regents. Appointees shall be individuals who are widely viewed
21	as having placed the broad public interest ahead of special

1 interests, are respected by the community, and are highly qualified to recruit and evaluate candidates for the governor's 2 3 consideration. 4 (h) Any member of the candidate advisory council whose 5 term has expired may continue in office as a holdover member until a successor is appointed; provided that a holdover member 6 shall not hold office for more than six months following the 7 8 expiration of the member's term of office. (i) A vacancy-occurring in the membership of the candidate 9 advisory council during a term shall be filled for the remainder 10 11 of the unexpired term thereof by the appointing authority who 12 appointed the member who ereates the vacancy. 13 (i) The candidate advisory council shall operate in a wholly-nonpartisan manner. No member-of the candidate advisory 14 council shall run for or hold-any elected-office of the State or 15 any of its political subdivisions while serving on the candidate 16 advisory-council. A member of the candidate advisory-council 17 shall resign from the candidate advisory council prior to filing 18 19 nomination papers for an elected office of the State or any of 20 its political subdivisions.

         (k) - The chairperson of the candidate advisory council
2
    shall be elected by a majority of the voting members of the
    candidate advisory council. A majority of the members to which
3

    the candidate advisory-council is entitled shall constitute a
5
    quorum to conduct business. The concurrence of a majority of
    the voting members of the candidate advisory council shall be
6
    necessary to make any action of the candidate advisory council
7
    valid. The candidate-advisory council shall meet annually and

    at other times as necessary. The candidate advisory council
    shall-be exempt from part I of chapter 92.

         (1) Members of the candidate advisory council shall serve
    without compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses,
12

    including travel expenses, necessary for the performance of
14
    their duties."]
         SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, all
15
    members of the board of regents of the University of Hawaii
16
    serving on the day of the effective date of this Act shall
17
    continue to serve until they are replaced by a member nominated
18
19
    and, with the advice and consent of the senate, appointed by the
20
    governor pursuant to this Act.

- SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon the 3
- ratification of a constitutional amendment authorizing the board 4
- of regents of the University of Hawaii to be nominated and, with 5
- the advice and consent of the senate, appointed by the governor 6
- 7 in compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution

8 of the State of Hawaii.

University of Hawaii; Board of Regents; Candidate Advisory Council; Repeal

Description:

Reestablishes the governor's authority to nominate and, with the advice and consent of the senate, appoint the members of the board of regents of the University of Hawaii by repealing the candidate advisory council for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii; effective upon ratification of a constitutional amendment to article X, section 6, of the Hawaii Constitution that deletes provisions related to the candidate advisory council for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii.
