A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ANIMALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that thousands of
- 2 animals, primarily dogs and cats, are deserted or abandoned
- 3 across Hawaii every year, contributing to increased animal
- 4 control costs, animal suffering and overpopulation, and
- 5 euthanasia rates at local animal shelters. Abandoned animals
- 6 are often subject to illness, injury, starvation, disease,
- 7 attacks by other animals, and even human cruelty. Abandoned
- 8 animals may also harm native wildlife. Weak penalties
- 9 associated with Hawaii's current animal desertion statute have
- 10 failed to adequately deter animal abandonment. Stronger
- 11 penalties would encourage pet owners to work with local shelters
- 12 and animal control contractors when a pet must be re-homed,
- 13 strengthen pet retention and the human-animal bond, and protect
- 14 pet owners and the animals themselves.
- The purpose of this Act is to increase penalties for animal
- 16 desertion.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 143-2.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "[+] §143-2.6[+] Animal desertion. (a) It shall be 4
- 5 of an animal that belongs to another person to leave the animal 6

unlawful for the owner of any animal or any person in possession

- without the intention of returning to it. 7 (b) Any person who violates this section shall be guilty
- 8 of a petty misdemeanor[-] and subject to a fine of \$1,000 in
- 9 addition to any other penalties; provided that if, after the
- 10 offense of animal desertion is committed, the animal suffers
- 11 death or substantial bodily injury, the person shall be guilty
- 12 of a misdemeanor and subject to a penalty of \$2,000 in addition
- **13** to any other penalties; provided further that each violation
- 14 shall constitute a separate offense.
- 15 (c) This section shall not apply to the release of an
- 16 animal as part of a population management program."
- **17** SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 18
- 19 begun before its effective date.

- 1 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.
