A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRIC VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 291-71, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§291-71 Designation of parking spaces for electric
- 4 vehicles; charging system. (a) Places of public accommodation
- 5 with at least one hundred parking spaces available for use by
- 6 the general public shall have at least one parking space per one
- 7 hundred spaces by July 1, 2017, and two parking spaces per one
- 8 hundred spaces by July 1, 2022, exclusively for electric
- 9 vehicles and equipped with an electric vehicle charging system
- 10 located anywhere in the parking structure or lot [by July 1,
- $11 \quad 2012$]; provided that no parking space designated for electric
- 12 vehicles shall displace or reduce accessible stalls required by
- 13 the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines.
- 14 Spaces shall be designated, clearly marked, and the exclusive
- 15 designation enforced. [Owners of multiple parking facilities
- 16 within the State may designate and electrify fewer-parking
- 17 spaces than required in one or more of their owned properties;

1	provided t	that the scheduled requirement is met for the total
2	number of	aggregate spaces on all of their owned properties.
3	This	subsection shall be enforced by the appropriate county
4	authority	having jurisdiction over planning and permitting, as
5	follows:	
6	(1)	A person or organization may file an open or anonymous
7		complaint with the county authority listing the places
8		of public accommodation that are not in compliance;
9	(2)	The county authority shall notify the property owner
10		of noncompliance and allow the owner three hundred
11		sixty-five days to comply with this subsection;
12	(3)	After the three hundred sixty-five days, the county
13		department shall conduct an inspection. If the owner
14		is not in compliance, the county authority shall issue
15		a warning allowing for an additional one hundred
16		eighty days for compliance;
17	(4)	If, after the warning issued under paragraph (3), the
18		owner is still in noncompliance, the county department
19		shall send a formal notice of violation that allows
20		for an additional ninety days for compliance; and

1	<u>(5)</u>	If after the additional ninety days allowed under
2		paragraph (4) the owner is still in noncompliance, an
3		administrative fine of \$200 per day shall begin to
4		accrue; provided that if the fine accrues to over
5		\$300,000, a lien shall be placed on the property.
6	(b)	There shall be an exemption from this section in cases
7	of financ	ial hardship or an engineering hardship in accordance
8	with rule	s adopted by the appropriate county authority having
9	jurisdict	ion over planning and permitting; provided that a
10	financial	hardship exemption shall not be granted for places of
11	public ac	commodation if a charging company installs the required
12	electrica	l charging stations at no cost.
13	-(d)-]	(c) For the purposes of this section:
14	"Ele	ctric vehicle" means:
15	(1)	A neighborhood electric vehicle as defined in section
16		286-2; or
17	(2)	A vehicle, with four or more wheels, that draws
18		propulsion energy from a battery with at least four
19		kilowatt hours of energy storage capacity that can be
20		recharged from an external source of electricity.
21	"Ele	ctric vehicle charging system" means a system that:

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1	(1)	Is capable of providing electricity from a non-vehicle	
2		source to charge the batteries of one or more electric	
3		vehicles;	
4	(2)	Meets recognized standards, including standard SAE	
5		J1772 of SAE International; and	
6	(3)	Is designed and installed in compliance with article	
7	·	625 of the National Electrical Code.	
8	"Pla	ce of public accommodation" has the same meaning as	
9	that provided in section 489-2[-], excluding a park, a campsite		
10	trailer facility, or other recreation facility."

13	SECT	ION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.	

Report Title:

Electric Vehicles; Allotment of Spaces

Description:

Requires, in places of public accommodation, a ratio of one electric vehicle parking stall per 100 stalls by 2017 and a ratio of two electric vehicle parking stalls per 100 stalls by the year 2022. Designates the appropriate county authority having jurisdiction over planning and permitting for enforcement. Specifies procedures for enforcement. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

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
