### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NON-GENERAL FUNDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to repeal and
3	abolish various non-general funds and accounts pursuant to the
4	recommendations made by the auditor in auditor's report no. 15-
5	19.
6	PART II
7	SECTION 2. The purpose of this part is to repeal the child
8	care licensing and registration special fund.
9	The legislature finds that the fund no longer serves the
10	purpose for which it was created.
11	SECTION 3. Section 346-159, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	repealed.
13	[" <del>[§346-159] Child-care licensing and registration special</del>
14	fund. (a) There is established within the state treasury, to
15	be administered by the department; the child care licensing and
16	registration special fund into which shall be deposited:

3	SECTION 4. On July 1, 2016, all unencumbered balances
4	remaining in the child care licensing and registration special
5	fund repealed by section 3 of this Act shall lapse to the credit
6	of the general fund.
7	PART III
8	SECTION 5. The purpose of this part is to repeal the
9	housing first special fund.
10	The legislature finds that the fund does not meet the self-
11	sustaining criterion because it relies on general fund
12	appropriations. Thus, the fund should be repealed.
13	SECTION 6. Section 346-378, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
15	"(a) The department of human services, in consultation
16	with the United States Department of Housing and Urban
17	Development, as necessary, shall implement housing first
18	programs and services, as the department deems appropriate for
19	clientele who would most likely benefit from and succeed with
20	the implementation of housing first programs and services, and

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1	subject to the availability of existing funds [ <del>or housing first</del>
2	special fund moneys]."
3	SECTION 7: Section 346-377, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	repealed.
5	[" <b>[§346-377] Housing first special fund.</b> (a) There-is
6	established in the state-treasury the housing first special
7	fund, into which shall be deposited:
8	(1) Appropriations by the legislature to the special fund;
9	and
10	(2) Gifts, donations, and grants from public agencies and
11	<del>private persons.</del>
12	Each county may provide matching funds, which shall also be
13	deposited into the housing first special fund.
14	(b) Moneys in the housing first special fund shall be
15	administered and expended by the department of human services
16	and shall be used to provide housing first programs and
17	services."]
18	SECTION 8. On July 1, 2016, all unencumbered balances
19	remaining in the housing first special fund repealed by section
20	7 of this Act shall lapse to the credit of the general fund.

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1	PART IV
2	SECTION 9. The purpose of this part is to repeal the
3	housing project bond special funds.
4	The legislature finds that the funds do not serve the
5	purposes for which they were created.
6	SECTION 10. Section 356D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
8	"(c) The trustee shall also be authorized by the authority
9	[to hold and administer any housing project bond special funds
10	established pursuant to section 356D-28, and] to receive and
11	receipt for, hold, and administer the revenues derived by the
12	authority from any public housing project or projects for which
13	the bonds are issued or the projects pledged to the payment of
14	the bonds, and to apply the revenues to the payment of the cost
15	of administering, operating, and maintaining the public housing
16	project or projects, to pay the principal of and the interest on
17	the bonds, to the establishment of reserves, and to other
18	purposes as may be authorized in the proceedings providing for
19	the issuance of the bonds."
20	SECTION 11. Section 356D-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

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21 amended to read as follows:

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1 "[+] §356D-28[+] Public housing revolving fund[; housing 2 project bond special funds]. (a) There is established the 3 public housing revolving fund to be administered by the 4 authority. Notwithstanding section 36-21, the proceeds in the 5 fund shall be used for long-term and other special financings of 6 the authority and for necessary expenses in administering this 7 chapter. 8 All moneys received and collected by the authority, (b) 9 not otherwise pledged, obligated, or required by law to be 10 placed in any other special fund, shall be deposited into the 11 public housing revolving fund. 12 [(c) A separate special fund shall be established for each 13 public housing project or projects financed from the proceeds of 14 bonds secured under the trust indenture. Each fund shall be 15 designated - "housing project bond special fund"-- and -shall-bear 16 any additional designation as the authority deems appropriate to 17 properly identify the fund. 18 (d) -- Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, all 19 revenues, income, and receipts derived from a public housing 20 project or projects financed from the proceeds of bonds or 21 pledged-to-the-payment of-principal of and interest-and premium

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1	on bonds, shall be paid into the housing project bond special
2	fund established for the public housing project or projects and
3	applied as provided in the proceedings authorizing the issuance
4	<del>of bonds.</del> ]"
5	SECTION 12. On July 1, 2016, all unencumbered balances
6	remaining in all housing project bond special funds repealed by
7	section 11 of this Act shall lapse to the credit of the general
8	fund.
9	PART V
10	SECTION 13. The temporary deposits - payroll overpayment
11	housing and community development corporation of Hawaii trust
12	fund, administratively created in 2006, is reclassified as a
13	trust account.
14	PART VI
15	SECTION 14. The following funds and accounts are
16	abolished:
17	(1) The blueprint for change program special fund
18	administratively established in 2010;
19	(2) The costs related to homeless assistance special fund
20	administratively established in 2003;

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1	(3)	The Hale Mahaolu special fund administratively created

4		fund administratively created in 2010;
5	(5)	The outreach services special fund administratively
