A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RAPID RE-HOUSING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to statutorily
- 2 establish the rapid re-housing assistance program.
- 3 SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by adding a new section to part XVII to be appropriately
- 5 designated and to read as follows:
- 6 "\$346-A Rapid re-housing assistance program. (a) Subject
- 7 to the availability of legislative appropriations, federal
- 8 grants, or both, the department shall establish and operate a
- 9 rapid re-housing assistance program.
- 10 The purpose of the program shall be to help homeless
- 11 families and individuals move as quickly as possible into
- 12 permanent housing and achieve stability in that housing.
- 13 (b) The rapid re-housing assistance program shall be
- 14 designed and operated by the department to qualify for federal
- 15 emergency shelter grants; provided that this provision shall not
- 16 be construed as prohibiting the use of other federal grants for
- 17 the program if allowable under federal law and regulations.
